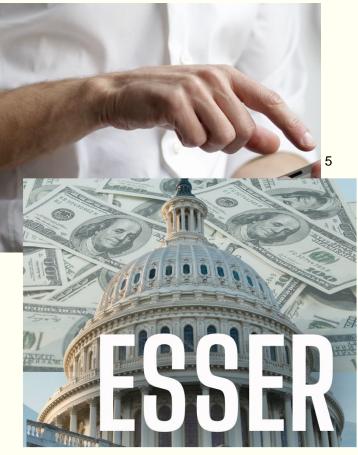

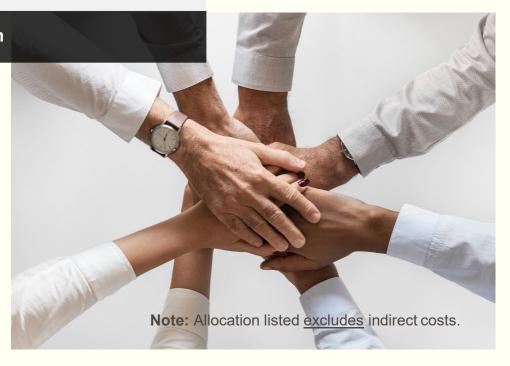

## ESSER II GRANT Allotment by School Year

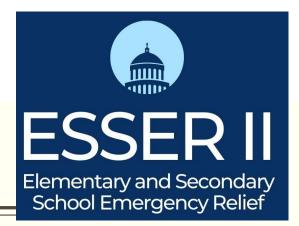


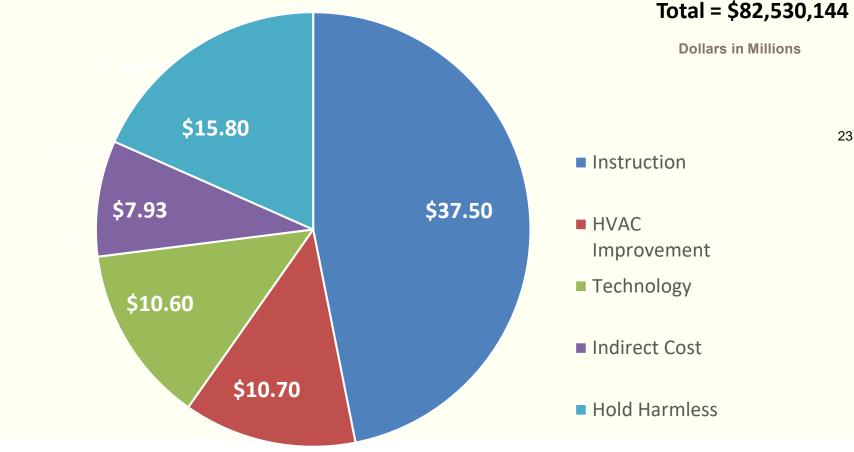

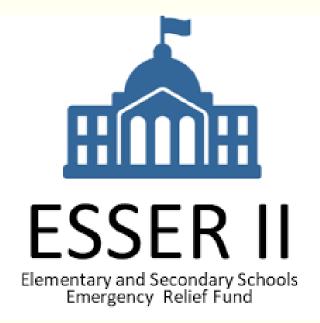

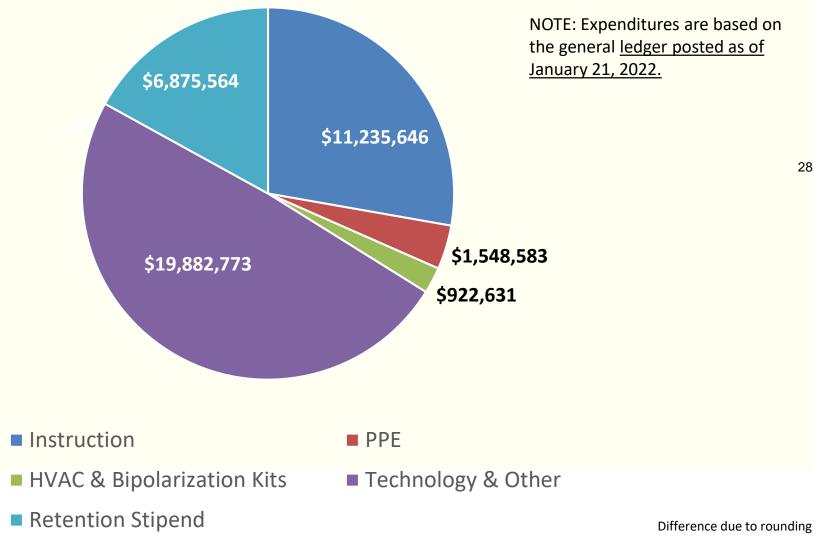

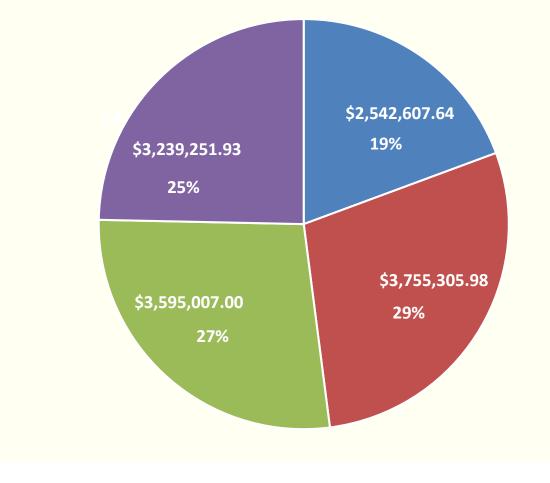


## **ESSER II & III Expenditures** by Major District Initiatives
