(Middlesex County Food Organization and Outreach Distribution Services). They collected 1,500 pounds of food! Congratulations to the Truman School for their generosity and caring.
- ▶ The Samsel Upper Elementary School is happy to report that six of their 5th Grade students were selected to attend the CJMEA (Central Jersey Music Education Association) Elementary Honors Chorus. Top students from choruses all around central NJ met together on Saturday, May 21st to rehearse and prepare a selection of choral music and then perform a concert that afternoon. - ▶ On Saturday, May 21, 2016 several hundred people participated in the first annual Saureville/POAC's (Parents of Autistic Children) Walk for A Difference at Sayreville War Memorial High School. The event, which was planned and coordinated by the Multiple Disability Program special education teachers at both the Samsel Upper Elementary School and Sayreville Middle School, included a resource fair and food and activities for anyone that was touched by someone with autism. Along with the four teachers mentioned above, over 60 staff members volunteered their time for this event. Over 500 people attended with 32 registered teams participating. As a district, we raised \$32,000 for POAC. These monies allow POAC to continue to provide training to teachers, staff, community helpers and families as well as provide free programs for children with autism and their families.


