WHEREAS, the Middlesex Regional Educational Services Commission has agreed to provide the required nursing services for local public school districts for the purpose of efficient delivery of services and greater cost effectiveness through cooperation and centralized administration;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Sayreville Board of Education enter into an agreement with the Middlesex Regional Educational Services Commission whereby the Commission will implement the law and administer the nonpublic school nursing services program for full-time students enrolled in the nonpublic school, **St. Stanislaus Kostka School**, located within the Sayreville district for the 2014-15 school year, in accordance with applicable law; and

BE IT further resolved that the Board of Education shall pay to the Commission 5% as an administrative fee of the entitlement funds received by the Board as state aid, per pupil, pursuant to said enactment.
