The Samsel Upper Elementary School has been selected as one of ten finalist schools to participate in the NJ Department of Agriculture's Jets' Play 60 "Eat Right, Move More" program for the 2013-14 school year. The school will be required to participate in the Jets Play 60 Challenge.
