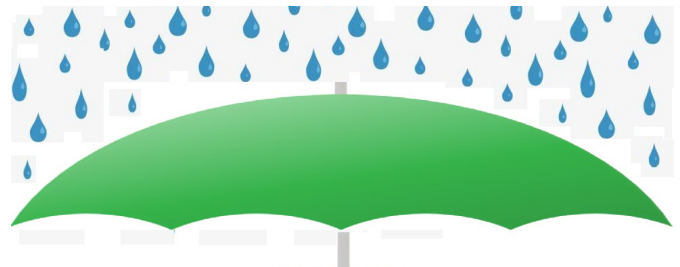

The Missouri Seal of Bilingualism is granted by KCPS to recognize students who demonstrate proficiency in English and one or more other world language before high school graduation. The recognition of attaining bilingualism becomes a part of the high school transcript for these students and serves to certify attainment of bilingualism for the community, employers and universities. This recognition is ideal for:

- Native English speakers studying a foreign language
- English language learners acquiring English and maintaining their native language

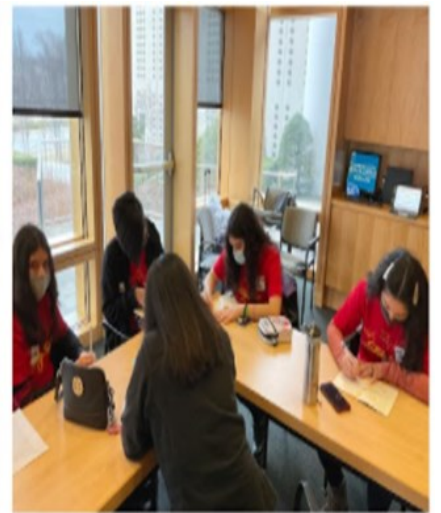
The Missouri Seal of Bilingualism is recognized and endorsed by several colleges, universities and businesses, including Missouri State University, Truman State University and Mastercard. Seal-holders will have opportunities to earn college credit and career development thanks to this recognition. The award becomes part of the student's transcript:

- Beneficial when applying to certain Missouri universities
- Beneficial when applying for jobs at certain Missouri businesses

The Great Kansas City Writing Project every year presents the Storytellers Program. NEHS Media Specialist, Ms. Carmen Truax, is one of the teacher consultants and she is the coordinator of the Seal of Bilingualism program. Each year, she brings a group of students to participate in the workshops. This year, students selected were from the Seal of Bilingualism Program.

Students attended a two-day workshop at the Kansas City Public Library Plaza Branch and one virtual session. Students wrote stories using different prompts while they added different elements chosen to bring with them to the event. All stories are original and written by students.

Low-Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP)

What is LIHWAP?

LIHWAP may be able to help you with a one-time payment for your water and/or wastewater (sewer) bill from November through September. The maximum amount you could get is \$750.00. LIHWAP can help with:

- Disconnection or reconnection fees.
- Threat of disconnection.
- Past-due bills.

Am I eligible?

You may be eligible for help if you:

- Are responsible for paying the utilities for your home
- Are a Missouri resident
- Are a U.S. citizen or have been legally admitted for permanent residence
- Have \$3,000 or less in your bank, retirement, or investment accounts
- Meet the income guidelines listed below:

How do I apply?

Apply online at mydss.mo.gov/utility-assistance or call 855-373-4636 to ask a team member to mail you an application.

You will need to submit your completed application to your local contract agency listed on the last page of the LIHWAP application.

When will I get my benefit?

Once you submit your application and required documents, your application will be reviewed in about 30 business days. You will receive a letter in the mail that tells you if you qualify for help and the amount you will get.

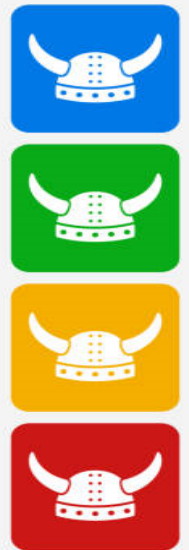
