FRYSC arranged for the field trip, scheduled workers for the event, and chaperoned FISD students.

Certified Personnel Evaluation Plan Amendment 4/22/2020

Certified Evaluation Plan (CEP) Modifications due to COVID-19

SB 177 signed into law on March 24, 2020, provides:

Section 8. Notwithstanding KRS 156.557 and 704 KAR 3:370, for the 2019-2020 school year, a local board of education may revise the district's certified evaluation plan due to the COVID-19 public health emergency.

In response to the COVID-19 public health crisis, SB 177 allows Kentucky school districts the ability to modify the district's Certified Evaluation Plan (CEP) for the 2019-2020 school year. The CEP can be modified to address the needs of the district during this time. CEP's modified for the 2019-2020 school year, only require local school board approval. **KDE approval is not required.**

Based on guidance from the Kentucky Department of Education – Office of Educator Licensure and Effectiveness (OELE), the following revisions are proposed to amend Fulton Independent School's 2019-2020 Certified Evaluation Plan:

- p. 11, Paragraph 3 under "Observations" CHANGE: There will be a minimum of one (1) full observation in the summative cycle.*
- p. 12, Paragraph 1, third bullet under "Observation Conferencing" CHANGE: Conferences will be held via Zoom, Google Meet, telephone, or other platform as agreed upon by the evaluator and evaluatee.
- p. 12, Paragraph 2, under "Summative Evaluation Conference" CHANGE: The summative evaluation will be documented utilizing the summative evaluation form in TASSEL. Digital signatures will be obtained. An email between evaluator and evaluatee will document confirmation that the summative evaluation conference took place.
- p. 13, Paragraph 2, under "Other Professional" CHANGE: Summative evaluation conferences will be held in the same manner as teachers.

Interim Commissioner of Education, Kevin C. Brown, issued a waiver on April 3, 2020, in response to the COVID-19 emergency. Pursuant to the authority granted in EO 2020-243 and with the approval of Lt. Gov. Jacqueline Coleman, Secretary of the Education and Workforce Development Cabinet, the waiver suspends KRS 158.141, which requires students to pass a 100-question civics test to graduate from a Kentucky public high school, for the 2019-2020 school year.
