



With the steady increases in new daily Covid cases and the fears of the latest variant, the government stated this week that they will be reinstating more restrictive social distancing guidelines and have extended its mandatory 10-day quarantine for all those traveling outside of Korea until January 6.

Our school has a number of families and faculty members who will be traveling outside Korea that will be impacted by this extension of the mandatory quarantine for all travelers. Because of this, **GSIS** will have online classes January **10-14**. Although we plan to resume with 100% face-to-face classes on Monday, January 17, we as a school need to be prepared to be online longer or possibly go to a hybrid model depending how the situation develops.

In addition, we will not be able to provide emergency childcare for elementary-aged children. We know how challenging this can be for families and will provide this if possible if online classes or hybrid classes are extended past January 14.

We will continue to monitor the situation over the break. We know this is not the news we want to hear. It is our hope and prayer that the current Covid situation will improve soon. We pray for everyone over the break; whether you and your families are staying and traveling in Korea or overseas.

In addition, we will be asking all school employees to have a negative PCR test prior to returning to campus on the 17th.

Recently, Grade 2 - 5 took the MAP (Measurement of Academic Progress) assessments. With this, we would like to provide the opportunity to share your child's results with you which have been handed to your child in a sealed envelope today for your information.

#### Please note the following:

Grade	Assessments	Notes
Grade 2	Math and Reading	As this is the first time Grade 2 is taking the MAP test, there is no comparative data from previous years.
Grade 3, 4, 5	Math, Reading and Language Usage	As this is the first time Grade 3 is taking the language usage portion of the MAP test, there is no comparative data from previous years.

All new students will have their results presented in a bar graph. Some of our EAL students only wrote the math portion of the MAP test, and did not access the reading or language usage portion due to the fact that they are still learning the English language.

#### **UPDATE: ARE YOU PLANNING ON GOING ABROAD?**

The Korean government announced on the 14th that it would extend the control measures for overseas imports, which had been in place for two weeks from the 3rd to the 16th. for another three weeks to block the inflow of the Corona 19 Omicron variant. Until January 6, next year, all overseas arrivals, including Koreans, must be quarantined for 10 days, regardless nationality of or vaccination status.

A pack of Home Surveys will be sent home with your child today for semester 2. Madagascar Musical Set Painting ASA began three weeks ago and I am seeing some great progress with the effort the students are putting in for the upcoming spring musical.

I also communicated about the need to show respect and follow instructions given from 4 upper secondary student leaders facilitating the activities in small groups (grade 11 - Amy Noh, Minjoo Kim, Joshua Kang and Yuna Song) as well. The set painting students have so far been A-M-A-Z-I-N-G in meeting my expectations and I am very proud of their work and thankful for their attitudes. The students have worked on making palm trees, meat and the central park zoo wall in the last 2 sessions. Spread out on the floor at the auditorium lobby with large brushes, there has been great teamwork, although at times the kids unconsciously put paint

on themselves or on the floor.

Yet, the students continued to display maturity in handling problems and great responsibility in organizing themselves. I am very thankful for the generous understanding of the parents for the clothes and shoes that went home with some new colors on as well. However, for the set painting ASA participants, it would be good if they choose to wear the least favorite clothes on Wednesdays until the set painting gets completed.

I look forward to seeing the stage in a full set after the winter break, and hope to see you all there at the musical in March.






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
## **UNIT OF INQUIRY UPDATE**

Before Spiritual Emphasis Week (SEW), some classes have started investigating into their next Unit of Inquiry.



### **COVID PROTOCOL**

#### **BEFORE COMING SCHOOL:**

- Avoid high-risk areas and activities (Hagwons, busy cafes, public transportation, etc.)
- Report any signs of sickness or possible contact or *any housemate under quarantine* to the school nurse immediately!
- Check for compliance with "COVID19 Home Survey form" at home each morning

- Fever check required to enter the bus for bus riders
- Fever check for walkin and drop off students at the front door

#### WHILE AT SCHOOL:

- Keep face masks over their mouths and noses at all times ("No Mask, No Talk")
- Maintain social distancing
- Regularly wash and sanitize hands
- Use the stairs in the correct direction
- Check temperature of all students before lunch
- Do not eat any food with others outside of the cafeteria including snack time (No talking while makes are off!)
- And again, report any signs of sickness to Nurse Ann immediately!

#### **COVID PROTOCOL**

#### **ADDITIONAL MEASURES:**

You may be curious if we have done anything else to prevent COVID considering the current situation in Korea. In addition to the above strategies in preventing COVID, we have also just recently added these precautions:

- 400 more shields were ordered and installed.
- Require KF 80 or KF94 masks (bring extra mask each day)
- Adjusted the direction of foot traffic in hallways, cafeteria, and stairwells
- Adjusted lunch schedule to reduce the density of students in the cafeteria
- Our youngest students (PK-Gr.1) eat lunch in their classrooms with shields (The tray cover is used to keep food safe, not to be exposed to the air.)
- Snack time with a shield
- Regular reminders to follow GSIS Covid Protocols (e.g HOS's morning announcement)
- Make sure of hand washing and disinfecting regularly, supervised by Nurse Kil
- Prepare an additional mask for swimming class in case of wet or missing
- Using individual water bottles (No direct drinking from the water fountains)
- Specific plan for removal of student with symptoms during school day to specific isolation room
- <u>Parents and visitors are not permitted in the building</u>, unless previous permission/arrangements have been made with the principal

#### STUDENTS AND STAFF WHO SHOULD STAY HOME:

- If they receive a self-quarantine notice from the health authorities.
- If anyone in the same household receives a self-quarantine notice:
   must not come to school until the quarantine finishes.
   However, if the student wishes to come to school, it may be permitted if a negative covid test result (Test needs to be performed within 2 days from EACH desired date of school attendance) is submitted EACH day before coming to school or the student immediately separated residence, without any contact, from the person in self-quarantine after receiving the quarantine notice
- If a family member of a student or staff member had a covid-19 test, they should stay home until the result comes out. (But preemptive tests for work such as hospital and aviation personnel, participation in competitions, etc are exceptions.)
