### **Purpose**

The purpose of this policy is to define the admission criteria required for applicants in order to be considered for admission to the College of Menominee Nation.

### **Scope of Application**

The Admission policy provides consistency to all students seeking admittance to CMN as a High School, New, Transfer, Returning, and Special Non-Degree seeking student.

### **Policy Statement**

1. The Admission policy complies with all Tribal, State, and Federal laws, the U.S. Department of Education and Tribal Colleges and Universities regulations.
2. The Admission policy ensures that qualified applicants have equal access to programs, courses, and facilities without regard to race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age, or handicap.
3. The Admission policy provides an opportunity for transfer credits.

### **Standard Admission Requirements**

As an open-enrollment college individuals are eligible for admission into CMN if all of the following is complete:

1. Submit High School Diploma, or High School Equivalency Diploma (HSED), or General Education Diploma (GED),
2. Submit Official College Transcript(s) (if transfer credit is requested),
3. Submit complete application for admission,
4. Submit Certificate of Indian Blood (CIB) or copy of Tribal Identification Card (if applicable), and
5. Complete Accuplacer Placement Test (if applicable).

Applicants not meeting the standard admission requirements will not be admitted.

CMN does not accept international students.

### **Additional Admission Requirements**

Program specifics require an additional admission procedure prior to enrollment. Prospective students seeking entrance to specific certain programs are first required to complete the standard admission procedure and be accepted into the College of Menominee Nation.
