Physics for Freshmen - Why?

1. Because the fundamentals of physics set the foundation for the more complex sciences of chemistry and biology.



Physics – study of the basic Laws of Nature, motion, forces, energy, heat, sound, & light





Biology – study of the most complex combinations of matter – living organisms.

2. Doing Physics First ensures that ALL our students are exposed to the fundamentals of science and technology, NOT just a select few.

Honors or College Prep Physics?

BOTH levels cover the exact same material and conduct similar laboratory explorations as the students build a solid conceptual foundation and mental models of physics concepts.

The primary differences are the pacing and the depth of mathematical application of physics principles.



A **college-level** course, largely assessed through cumulative tests




Global Studies (CP)


- Introduce basic Catholic teachings and traditions.
