- Share strategies parents can use at home
- Explain how teachers and parents will communicate about student progress
- Describe opportunities for parents to volunteer, observe, and participate in the classroom

## Our Goals for Student Achievement

### District Goals

**By June 2022, all students will be at grade level or higher in both math and reading.**

**We will get there by:**

1. Increasing each student's fluency and understanding in reading across all grade levels by 15% over 3 years.
2. Increasing each student's competency in math computation, word problems and number operations by 15% over 3 years.

### School Goals

**By 2022, our students will make a 20% gain in math and reading; 74% of students will be at grade level in reading, and 78% at grade level in math.**

Our data show the need to focus on the following North Carolina State Standards:

- In reading – the standard of comprehension and understanding the author's purpose.
- In math – the standard of strengthening our basic skills and math computation.

## Teachers, Parents, Students – Together for Success

### In Our Classrooms

The grade-level team will work with students and their families to support students' success in the North Carolina Standards for reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be

- Develop a weekly folder or Google Classroom with materials demonstrating student progress. Send home strategies to help parents support the learning goals.
- Use vocabulary instruction and read alouds to incorporate new words. Send new words to families each unit with information on how to incorporate new words in daily conversations.
- Design a fun family night and share classroom project-based learning strategies that help students connect personal experiences to their deeper learning.
- Develop goals with students that focus on increasing their math fluency skills. Send goals to parents along with some practical ideas for supporting their learning goals at home.

### At Home

Tar River Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key at-home activities will be

- Use the weekly folder or Google Classroom to discuss my child's learning goals and use the teacher's materials to support my child's learning at home.
- Review new words with my child weekly. Remember to use new words in daily conversations.
- Read with my child daily and talk about how the story connects with things that he/she has experienced. Attend the Storytelling Night literacy event to practice new ways to support my child as a reader.
- Use the math goals and related games or strategies the teacher sends home to improve my child's math skills.
