#### P.E. Waiver Information

Core physical education credit (required for graduation) can be earned through participation in qualifying activities. Students may earn (1) core physical education credit for each qualifying activity. Students may earn a maximum of (2) credits through participation in qualifying activities. Students may not earn (2) credits by participating in the same activity over the course of different seasons.

Students applying for non-traditional credit must complete core physical education graduation requirements by their 4th semester in high school. Students that have not completed the requirement will be scheduled into a core physical education section in their 5th semester of high school.

**Waiver forms must be signed by both the student and parent at the conclusion of the qualifying activity.**

## Course Offerings

### Transition from MS to HS (by invitation)

#### **Freshman Engage (Math Lab, English Lab, Physical Education)**

Freshman Engage is a program designed for incoming 9<sup>th</sup> grade students to support a successful transition to CPHS; students may be enrolled based on teacher recommendation, ISTEP, and/or ACT Aspire data. Students being recommended for Freshman Engage will be notified by a CPHS counselor. Engage builds character and confidence while acclimating students to the culture of CPHS. Students will work closely with a diverse team of educators with common goals for student success, both academically and behaviorally. Students will gain skill development through a preview of the 9<sup>th</sup> grade curriculum in English, algebra, art and social studies. Student skill gaps will be identified and remediated throughout the academic portion of this program. A physical fitness component will also be included in the course. Two physical education credits, one Math Lab elective credit and one English Lab elective credit will be awarded upon the successful completion of this course. **Daily attendance is required.** Registration for this course closes on May 13, 2022.

#### **Core Class Restart (Remediation and Grade Replacement)**

This class is designed for students who earned a semester "D" in a core class during the school year. This class will serve as a grade replacement opportunity for students if they review and display mastery of course standards not originally demonstrated. Students will utilize online resources to address skill gaps with the intention of demonstrating increased understanding/mastery. The amount of time/days needed to address skill gaps will differ for each student based on the noted areas of deficiencies throughout all 18 weeks of the semester and a pre-assessment administered by the summer school teacher. Once mastery has been proven, students are awarded the grade change and dismissed from the remainder of summer school.

#### **College Application Seminar**

This seminar is intended to give incoming seniors extra support as they pursue the next step on the path to fulfilling their post-secondary goal. The seminar will assist students with the completion of college applications while offering guidance from our guidance and college and career counselors, as well as an English teacher. We will start with a review of different kinds of post-secondary opportunities (2-year & 4-year colleges/universities) and examine what admissions officers really look for when screening prospective students. Students who have not yet fulfilled college entrance examination score requirements on the ACT and/or SAT will work with a teacher and online programs to help identify and remediate skill deficiencies.

As the seminar progresses, students will finalize their college lists and complete their applications. They will also practice interviewing skills for potential college interviews. Time will be devoted to the Common Application and any specific writing prompts on student applications. Instructors will assist seminar members through an interactive, student-centered format. Along with group instruction, students will receive individualized feedback via one-on-one conferencing with a guidance counselor to assist with the development of a college strategy for the 2020-2021 school year. Activities will include the creation of a calendar with deadlines, analysis of school selection and financial aid requirements. Communication by instructor will be sent to students who sign up for seminar.

**Format:** Class dates will be from August 2nd - August 3rd from 7:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. in the LGI.



## Enrichment (Online)

Crown Point High School is excited to offer the following online courses as learning opportunities for our students. Note: All students enrolled in an online enrichment course must complete the CP 2.0 Orientation Course found in Buzz. A student's summer school class(es) will not be visible in Buzz until the student completes the CP 2.0 Orientation Course.

### Online – Health – 10, 11, 12

This class is designed for students that have not yet taken the 1-semester graduation requirement course for health. All course content will be available through Buzz. The coursework can be completed at any location where the students have internet access. Students will work within a cohort and be required to submit assignments each week. If a vacation conflict occurs, the student must clear the absence with the instructor in advance. Students may come to CPHS during regular summer school hours for computer access. Students will receive regular feedback electronically from their instructor. One semester of health credit will be awarded upon the successful completion of this course.

### Online – Preparing for College and Careers – 12

This class is for students who have enrolled in the Internship/Work-Based Learning (WBL) program during the 2022-2023 school year. All students are required to complete Preparing for College and Careers prior to participating in the WBL program. Students may come to CPHS during regular summer school hours for computer access. Students will receive regular feedback electronically from their instructor. Students will receive one elective credit by successful completion of the course.

### Online – Government – 11, 12

This class is designed for students that have not yet taken the 1-semester graduation requirement course for government. All course content will be available through Buzz. The coursework can be completed at any location where the students have internet access. Students will work within a cohort and be required to submit assignments each week. If a vacation conflict occurs, the student must clear the absence with the instructor in advance. Students may come to CPHS during regular summer school hours for computer access. Students will receive regular feedback electronically from their instructor. One semester of government credit will be awarded upon the successful completion of this course.

### Online - Economics – 11, 12

This class is designed for students that have not yet taken the 1-semester graduation requirement course for economics. All course content will be available through Buzz. The coursework can be completed at any location where the students have internet access. Students will work within a cohort and be required to submit assignments each week. If a vacation conflict occurs, the student must clear the absence with the instructor in advance. Students may come to CPHS during regular summer school hours for computer access. Students will receive regular feedback electronically from their instructor. One semester of economics credit will be awarded upon the successful completion of this course.



## Enrichment (Classroom)

### Core P.E. – General Fitness – 9, 10, 11, 12

This class is designed for students that have not fulfilled their physical education graduation requirement. Two semesters of core physical education credit will be awarded upon successful completion of this course (attendance/participation at 22 out of 24 sessions are required for 2 credits; 11 days for one credit). Students will be provided a PE uniform and will be expected to wear it during class.

Students participating in Core P.E. must have a CPCSC physical form completed and signed by a doctor. The physical forms are to be turned in to the P.E. instructor the first day of class. Physical obtained after May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022 will be applied to the 2022-23 school year. Students should report to the cafeteria on Monday, June 13<sup>th</sup> at 8 a.m. with their physicals and dressed in shorts, t-shirts, and gym shoes.





## Credit Recovery

Students taking credit recovery courses will be using digital content in place of traditional textbooks. Students will attend classes until they have successfully completed their course requirement. Due to the “attend until you complete the material” nature of the course, there is not a seat time / attendance requirement. However, students must attend the classroom component of credit recovery until they are released by the instructor. The credit recovery lab will open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 12:00 p.m. each day. Students that do not complete their course by July 17th will not be able to carry the course into the fall semester. The cost will be **\$25.19** per course.

### Algebra I

This class is designed for students that have failed at least one semester of algebra during the regular school year. Students will attend this class until they successfully complete their algebra I graduation requirement. This class is open for all incoming 10th - 12th grade students.

### Algebra II

This class is designed for students that have failed at least one semester of algebra II during the regular school year. Students will attend this class until they successfully complete algebra II. This class is open for all incoming 12th grade students.

### Biology

This class is designed for students that have failed either or both semesters of Biology and are looking to recover the credit in order to apply it to a CPHS diploma. Students will attend this class until they successfully complete their credit requirement. This class is open for all incoming 10th - 12th grade students.

### English 9

This class is designed for students that have failed at least one semester of English 9 during the regular school year and are looking to recover the credit in order to apply it to a CPHS diploma. Students will attend this class until they successfully complete their English 9 graduation requirement. This class is open for all incoming 10th - 12th grade students.

### English 10

This class is designed for students that have failed at least one semester of English 10 during the regular school year and are looking to recover the credit in order to apply it to a CPHS diploma. Students will attend this class until they successfully complete their English 10 graduation requirement. This class is open for all incoming 11th - 12th grade students.

### English 11

This class is designed for students that have failed at least one semester of English 11 during the regular school year and are looking to recover the credit in order to apply it to a CPHS diploma. Students will attend this class until they successfully complete their English 11 graduation requirement. This class is open for all incoming 12th grade students.

### English 12

This class is designed for students that have failed at least one semester of English 12 during the regular school year and are looking to recover the credit in order to apply it to a CPHS diploma. Students will attend this class until they successfully complete their English 12 graduation requirement. This class is open for students that failed 12<sup>th</sup> grade English during the 2022-2022 school year.

### US History

This class is designed for students that have failed either or both semesters of US History and are looking to recover the credit in order to apply it to a CPHS diploma. Students will attend this class until they successfully complete their credit requirement. This class is open for all incoming 12<sup>th</sup> grade students.

### World History

This class is designed for students that have failed either or both semesters of Geography/History of the World and are looking to recover the credit in order to apply it to a CPHS diploma. Students will attend this class until they successfully complete their credit requirement. This class is open for all incoming 10th - 12th grade students.
