YEARBOOKS

It's time to get your Dilworth yearbooks ordered. Yearbooks are \$15 and will be handed out at the end of the school year. Here are the steps to order:

1. Go to yearbookordercenter.com
2. Input our Dilworth code: 11880
3. It should show Dilworth Elementary PTA - click continue.

4. Click "order a yearbook".
5. You can adjust the quantity you want then click continue.
6. In the menu that pops up, click student.
7. Type in your student's name and click find student.
8. Unless you have already ordered, it will say "No Results Matched Your Search" then click "Click here to add your student".
9. Enter their first and last name and grade - if you don't enter each of your children, we won't know which class to deliver them to, so please add each child you are ordering for.
10. Once you hit continue, it should say it added your student. Click ok, then next.
11. Once all the information looks correct, click check out and it will bring you to a place to enter your credit card information.

If you are wondering if you already ordered a yearbook at the first of the year when you ordered pictures, you *did not*. This is the first time yearbook orders have opened up this year. **Orders need to be placed by April 4th!** If you have any questions or any problems with ordering, please contact Jenny Jensen (801-502-3359) or Kristie Sharp (801-618-7193).

If you have taken any photos at the school this year that you want included, we are still collecting candid photos until March 25th. You can send them to dilworthphotos@gmail.com. If you take photos after March 25th, please still send them in because we can use them in the end of year slideshow, but they will not appear in the yearbook. If your child didn't have their picture taken with Interstate Studio at the beginning of the year, please send us a photo of your child so they can be included in the grade level portraits.

TAKE NOTE!

In the months of February and March, Dilworth students, Kindergarten through Third Grade, have attended music classes with Mrs. Berg and learned about the composers DEBUSSY and MOZART. I shared with them one of my MOST favorite musical compositions, *Claire de Lune*, by Debussy. We talked about IMPRESSIONISM and using our own imaginations to interpret what we hear in the music, maybe it's the sun setting and the moon rising, maybe it's the stars shining or the reflection of it all dancing over rippled water. We talked about Mozart and his enthusiasm for life! We listened to William Zhang, at age 6, play Piano Sonata No. 16 in C Major 1st movement. The children enjoyed watching for his gigantic smile as he finished his piece. He's incredible!

Along with learning about these composers, we talked about TEMPO markings, the speed of music. We listened to the METRONOME and sang our songs in all different momentums from LARGO and ALLEGRO, to ADAGIO and PRESTO!

We enjoyed a little Irish Dancing and even tried some ourselves as we sang a song for St Patrick's Day and listened to the bagpipes play.

We LOVE to SING in music class! Each grade is focusing on songs that they will be performing in their upcoming grade programs to celebrate the end of the school year. For example, our Kindergarteners are singing about making friends and our Second Graders are learning about how each of us are uniquely wonderful.
