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Bi-Literacy information

Thanks so much for meeting with me today! I did some research when I got back to my room for the Seal of Biliteracy. It looks like each state does their own thing but all seem to have the same general requirements. Since Fayette County is the only school in our state that does the program, I dug through their website and found out what their process was. They created an application that the students had to fill out by February 15th. To earn the seal students must have:

- met all Language Arts graduation requirements set by the school
- an ACT score of 18+ on English and a 20+ in reading (or an SAT of 440+ on both reading and writing)
- 3+ on the AP Spanish/German exam as a junior. If a graduating senior wants to apply for the seal but hasn't take the AP exam yet they can take the AAPPL exam (not sure where that is given around here - it may be online) or the STAMP test (given online). They have to score Intermediate-Mid on all portions of the exam.
