-Hazel Health Presentation

Dr. Chew presented the various services that Hazel Health offers to school districts. The goal is to offer quality care for all students while maximizing learning time and saving families money and time. Hazel offers both a physical & mental health component. -Human Sexuality Instruction Curriculum Presentation

Amy Keith presented a curriculum to be used for the health course beginning 2022-2023. The curriculum covers 100 percent of the TEKS for the health course, including the human sexuality instruction. Some of the major points were:

\*Abstinence is the preferred choice of behavior in relationship to all sexual activity for unmarried persons of school age.

\*Abstinence, if used consistently and correctly, is the only 100 percent effective way to prevent pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, infectio with human immunodeficiency virus or acquired immune deficiency syndrome, and the emotional trauma associated with adolescent sextual activity.

\*Parents will receive an informational letter of the specific topics that will be covered and parents will opt in for their student to participate in the human sexuality instruction piece of the health course.

The textbook that includes the TEKS for the health course and has been approved by TEA is Texas *Health Skills for High School* published by The Goodheart-Willcox Company, Inc. A sample textbook and instructor's edition was available for viewing. A second meeting will be held on April 8, 2022 for anyone who wants to review and/or

discuss the curriculum being recommended to the board. There was time allowed for questions and discussion at the end of the presentation.

Motion made by Stephanie Reeves to recommend this curriculum to the board for adoption, second by Hope Campbell. Motion carried unanimously.
