In 1 week, we can't teach your child to fly or to hone their telekinesis skills, but we can introduce your child to the powerful world of coding. Campers will complete coding challenges that will give them a fun first introduction to computer science. Coding challenges (like Dancing Boogie Bot and Design your own Candy Quest Troll) will nurture your child's problem-solving skills, logic and creativity.</p>

Campers will work together to help a shipwrecked Sir Harley Houndstooth III survive and (hopefully) escape a desert island. This camp will build on students' natural curiosity through fun and challenging hands-on activities to learn the Engineering Design Process and STEM Principles. Campers are encouraged to use what they know about science, math and engineering to explore new challenges. Through hands-on, project-based activities, students will develop and enhance their problem solving, critical thinking and collaboration skills.</p>

We will focus on the fundamental elements of visual storytelling that enable the students to create their own projects. Students may need to provide their own costumes or props.</p>

Campers will be introduced to the sport of Disc Golf, one of the fastest-growing free outdoor activities. Similar to golf, the goal of disc golf is to complete each hole in as few throws, or strokes, as possible. Instead of using golf clubs and a golf ball, disc golfers use a flying disc to land in a disc catching target. Throughout the week, students will learn disc throwing fundamentals, putting, disc golf rules and strategy and then we will spend the last day playing a round at a real disc golf course at Stumpy Creek Park. We will have plenty of discs for the campers to use, but they are also welcome to bring their own.</p> <p>Please note that parents will need to drop off and pick up their campers at Stumpy Creek Park on Thursday (the last day of camp).</p>

Week one includes the use of sewing tools and basic machine operation. Participants will make a tote/gym bag and other projects as time allows.
