Healthy Schools - Competition Time!

Last week the Year 5 Healthy Schools Ambassadors delivered assemblies to KS1 and KS2. They were brilliant and the children listened intently to their key messages on how to Strive for 5!

The ambassadors talked about the need to:

- Strive for at least 5 portions of different fruits and vegetables a day
- The fruit and veg section is one of the largest on the Eatwell Guide
- Fruit and vegetables form an important part of a healthy, balanced diet as they contain essential vitamins, minerals and fibre
- Aim to eat a wide range of different coloured fruit and vegetables think 'Eat the Rainbow'
- Fresh, frozen, tinned, dried and juice all count towards your 5-a-day
- 1 portion fits in the palm of your hand

The Ambassadors also announced a poster competition. All the children were asked to create a colourful poster containing some of these key messages. There will be a prize for the best poster in KS1 and also a prize for KS2. The ambassadors will be judging the posters. So please hand in your entries to Mrs Whelan by 4th April. Autism Ambassadors at Lindfield

The Academy is launching a new initiative which will be introduced in Assembly next week. Children in Key Stage 2 will have the opportunity to apply to be an Autism Ambassador to help themselves and their peers develop an understanding of the impact of having Autism Spectrum Disorder. There is an increasing awareness of the real difference that can be made to an autistic pupil when they are supported by staff and peers who have a good understanding of their condition. The children who become part of this special group will be involved in monthly meetings to discuss and action initiatives to support pupils.



Curriculum Corner-Mathematics

At Lindfield Primary Academy, **maths** is at the heart of our curriculum. We follow the mastery approach where we help children develop a deep understanding of mathematical concepts. We know how important it is for parents to understand how we calculate in the different year groups so we filmed some video clips of the children demonstrating this. These can be found on the school website in the maths section. Remember to keep practising fluency skills at home. These include addition and subtraction facts to 20 in Key Stage One as well as 2, 3, 5 and 10 times table in Year 2. In Key Stage Two we focus on 2 - 12 times tables. Quick and efficient recall of these facts frees up working memory and supports reasoning and problem solving. Numbots and Times Tables Rockstars support this brilliantly. There is also a new free app from White Rose called 1 Minute Maths - we would highly recommend downloading this for speedy practice. The children love taking part in competitions and we had a fantastic level of participation in the 'Twosday Challenge' - thank you and well done to everyone who took part.

Bowled over with Success




Girls cricket tournament

Safeguarding Spotlight:

What is safeguarding?

Safeguarding is the action that is taken to promote the welfare of children and protect them from harm.
Safeguarding means:

- protecting children from abuse and maltreatment
- preventing harm to children's health or development
- ensuring children grow up with the provision of safe and effective care
- taking action to enable all children and young people have the best outcomes.

Child protection is one part of the safeguarding process. It focuses on protecting individual children identified as suffering or likely to suffer significant harm. This includes child protection procedures that detail how to respond to concerns about a child. Safeguarding children and child protection applies to all children up to the age of 18.

At LPA, our first and foremost priority is to keep your child safe and healthy. There are safeguarding notices around our school to remind all visitors who the designated safeguarding officers are (DSLs) here in the academy:
