Additional support with food, fuel, clothing and essentials is available through the **Community Hub** on 0330 222 7980 Open: 8am - 8pm Mon – Fri, 9am – 5pm weekends and bank holidays. Furthermore, if you are in receipt of any of the benefits below, it is likely that your family are entitled to the **Pupil Premium Grant**. This will provide your family with access to further support.

- Support as a result of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit
- Working Tax Credit

- Understand there are some risks online, and that these come in different forms
- Know where to turn for help when they encounter risks, or when something difficult or unpleasant happens
- Can learn and recover from their experiences.

**'Beware of Lurking Trolls'** is a campaign designed to help protect children from online harm. It centres around a storybook '*Peril of the Possessed Pets*' and is used in primary schools with children aged 7 to 11 years. Can you try this resource and let us know how you get on?
