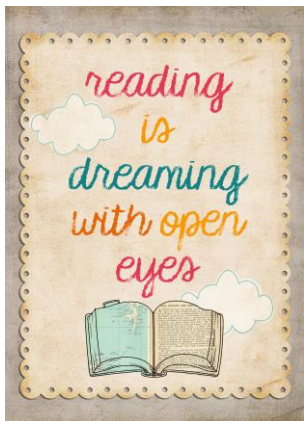
History of the Buddy Poppy Program

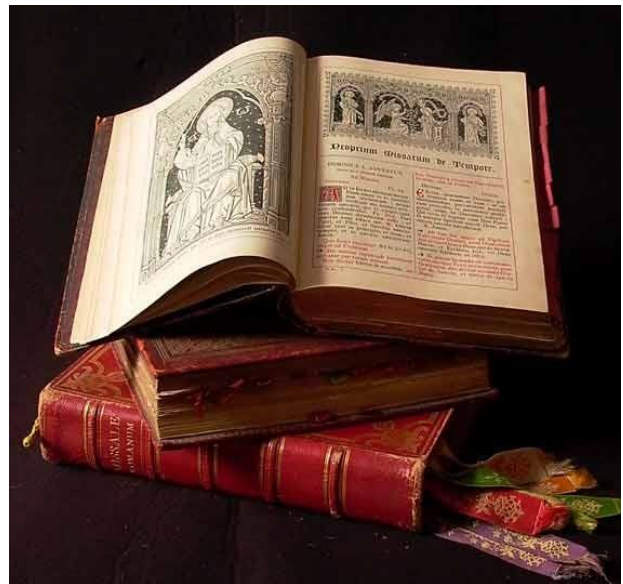
Battle of the Books Program
