






Quality of Public Schools




Specific Perceptions I


Specific Perceptions II






Adequately Funded




Comparative Tax Climate



Referendum Predisposition






Property Tax Increase for Operating Levy




\$257PPU Operating Levy




Reason for Levy Position







Eden Prairie School Board Executive Limitations Policy Monitoring Process

The Board is accountable to the state and taxpayers for district performance. The Board is responsible to set **Executive Limitations Policies** which define parameters within which the Superintendent may act to accomplish the Board's Ends Policies. One way the Board monitors district performance is by monitoring the Executive Limitations Policies and the Superintendent's **compliance** with them. In accordance with Governance Process 4.2.3, ELs monitoring is done in two phases:

Prior to the beginning of the monitoring cycle (which runs from Aug-Dec), the Board monitors the Superintendent's **Operational Interpretation (OI) of the ELs Policies,** and whether the **evidence supports the OI**. (See below.) The only exception to this cycle is EL 2.9 which is monitored biannually in June.

Following the completion of the monitoring cycle, the Board monitors the Superintendent's **assertion of compliance/noncompliance** with the policies. (See below.)

Prior to the Beginning of the Monitoring Cycle

Operational Interpretation (OI):

Prior to the beginning of the Executive Limitations (ELs) policy monitoring cycle, the Superintendent is responsible for drafting/editing an **Operational Interpretation (OI)** for each of the ELs Policies. This OI includes the Superintendent's *interpretation* of the policy, *justification* for that interpretation, and a *measurement plan* which supports the interpretation.

The Board makes a motion, seconds, discusses and votes whether the Superintendent's Operational Interpretation is reasonable or not reasonable. If the OI is voted **reasonable**, the OI constitutes the basis for the Superintendent's assertion of compliance with the policy at the end of the monitoring cycle.

If the entire OI, or a portion of it, is voted **not reasonable**, monitoring of the policy ceases, there is no vote on the evidence, and the Superintendent commits to bring back a revised OI, within a time period acceptable to the Board, for a revote.

Sample Motions for reasonableness of the OI:

"I move that the Operational Interpretation is reasonable" or

"I move that the Operational Interpretation is reasonable with the exception of..." or

"I move that the Operational Interpretation is **not reasonable**"

Eden Prairie School Board Executive Limitations Policy Monitoring Process (cont'd.)

Evidence:

If the Board votes that the Operational Interpretation is **reasonable**, the Board makes a motion, seconds, discusses and votes whether the measurement plan provides evidence which **supports** or does **not support** the Operational Interpretation.

If the evidence is voted as **supporting** the OI, it constitutes the measurement by which the policy is monitored for compliance.

If the entire evidence, or a portion of it, is voted as **not supporting** the OI, the Superintendent commits to bring back revised evidence, within a time period acceptable to the Board, for a revote.

Sample Motions for the Evidence supporting the Operational Interpretation:

"I move that the Evidence supports the Operational Interpretation" or

"I move that the Evidence **supports** the Operational Interpretation **with the exception of...**"or

"I move that the Evidence does not support the Operational Interpretation"

Following the end of a monitoring cycle for the past year

Board acceptance of Executive Limitations Monitoring Reports:

At the end of the ELs policies monitoring cycle, the Superintendent drafts a monitoring report for each EL and presents it to the Board with an assertion of **compliance** or **non-compliance**.

The Board may ask **clarifying** questions of the Superintendent regarding his assertion for ELs reports, preferably prior to the Board Business Meeting. (This is not an opportunity for a Board member to offer their opinion regarding the reasonableness of the Superintendent's assertion.)

Following a time for questions at the Board table, a motion is made, seconded, discussed and voted upon to **accept** or **not accept** the Superintendent's assertion of **compliance** or **non-compliance** with the Executive Limitation.

If the Board finds that the Superintendent is **not in compliance** with the EL, the Superintendent and Board agree to a date by which the Superintendent will bring forward evidence of compliance for remonitoring.

Eden Prairie School Board Executive Limitations Policy Monitoring Process (cont'd.)

Sample motions for monitoring the assertion of compliance or non-compliance:

"I move to accept the Superintendent's assertion of compliance with EL policy xx.xx."

"I move to **NOT** accept the Superintendent's assertion of **compliance** with EL policy xx.xx."

"I move to accept the Superintendent's assert of non-compliance with EL policy xx.xx."

Board Member tips for monitoring an EL Policy Monitoring Report:

Look for the use of rates, ratios, percentages, comparisons and trends over time.

Look for **verifiable evidence** of **compliance** with Executive Limitations rather than the Superintendent's opinion or belief.

If the Board votes that the Superintendent is not in compliance with an EL, the board should expect, within an agreed upon timeframe, that the Superintendent will bring forward evidence of compliance.

Superintendent tips for drafting ELs Policies Monitoring Reports:

Place raw numbers in context.

Provide the best evidence you have, even if not perfect, and discuss limitations. Identify a date by which better evidence will be available.

Summarize relevant evidence in key categories to provide "governance-friendly" information that gives evidence of compliance.

Make sure assertions are clearly visible in the report.

When asserting **non-compliance** with an EL, include a commitment as to when in the future the Board can expect the evidence that demonstrates compliance.



 Ends policy monitoring reports have not disclosed budget allocations or financial resources as a barrier to reaching the Ends during the monitoring period. Resources during the pandemic were directly steered to support the outcomes of the Ends during the Pandemic through the budget process approved by the board which with a few examples being: extra supports for students through EP Online, building substitutes, paraprofessional support for students online, managing class sizes to increase support and keep students in school, implement increased layers of COVID mitigation strategies to ensure as much in-person learning as possible, while also moving choice programs and other strategic initiatives forward to ensure long term success toward achieving the ends. The district used a multi-year financing plan provided by our financial advisor, Ehlers & Associates, during 2020-21. The district business office also creates a multi-year financial projection model which is studied by the Superintendent's Cabinet and the Citizen's Finance Advisory Committee. The summarized financial projections from the plan are disclosed in the Informational Overview section of the 2021-22 Annual Budget Book and was presented to the school board in January 2021. 	29

Operational Interpretation:	
 I interpret this policy to mean that no later than the third quarter of the fiscal year (January – March) the Administration will present and enact "Budget Assumptions," any material reinvestment of unbudgeted revenues or savings, and a timeline for action when building the next annual budget. An assumption is a "thing that is accepted as true or certain to happen without proof." When creating a budget, assumptions are expectations that provide a starting point for the process. Assumptions are most often relative to revenue and expenditure forecasts. They also can be expressed as managerial decisions, anticipated legislative actions, and changes to student enrollment. To fully disclose and make clear the budget must reflect the conditions and expectations in which it was created and also anticipate those that may be in effect during its implementation. A published timeline of discrete actions to be performed provides a framework for budget work to be 	30
completed and also provides transparency to the process.	
Justification: The district budget must adhere to financial realities. In order to conform with the "means" and "ends" expressed via the Policy Governance structure, it is important to promote understanding of the budgeting process as well as the tenets or "assumptions" used to create the annual financial plan or budget for the District.	
Measurement Plan:

 Evidence: The 2021-22 budget timeline and 2021-22 budget assumptions were presented to the School Board at its January 25, 2021 meeting and finalized at its March 22, 2021 Board meeting. The district budget was presented to the School Board at its May 24, 2021 meeting and was approved by the School Board at its June 28, 2021 meeting.

Operational Interpretation: I interpret this to mean that upon the completion of the annual financial audit, the general fund shall demonstrate a minimum of 8% of annual expenditures within the unassigned portion of the district's fund balance.	
 Justification: External independent auditors generally recommend a minimum fund balance equaling one month of expenditures, or approximately two payroll periods. A comparison of neighboring district fund balance policies and recommendations places 8% in a reasonable or comparable range. The State of Minnesota requires school districts to undergo a financial audit each fiscal year. 	31
 Measurement Plan: Compliance shall be demonstrated by: The projected general fund balance presented as part of the annual budget process demonstrates a balance of >8% of projected expenditures, and The external audit confirms the general fund balance of >8% of reported expenditures at the conclusion of the fiscal year audited. 	
 Evidence: The 2020-21 mid-year budget update projected an unassigned General Fund balance of 14.7% (greater than 8%) for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021. The Executive Audit Summary presented by the auditing firm of MMKR & Co, P.A at the November 22, 2021 meeting of the School Board confirmed a June 30, 2021 year-end unassigned fund balance of 14.2% (greater than 8%). This calculation of unassigned fund balance percentage includes, in the denominator, expenditures for operating capital. For consistency purposes, the district excludes operating capital 	

	expenditures from its internal calculation of unassigned fund balance, which remains in a restricted and self-contained fund. The district's internal calculation of unassigned fund balance was 16.3%.

	I interpret this policy to mean that as the annual budget is developed, the Administration collects input from reputable sources as a function of the budget development process. Those sources could be either external or internal to the District. External <i>sources</i> may consist of, but are not limited to, the federal government, the Minnesota Department of Education, Minnesota Statute and Rule, local community advisory committees, and parents (as defined in EL 2.3). District employees are considered internal sources.	
	Public schools are local governmental entities, and therefore function as representatives of the community, state, and nation. The "public good" requires a budget process that is relatively transparent and seeks input from its customers and employeeseach of whom have varying interests and values. With that said, it is important to note that the professionals hired by the District are highly trained and knowledgeable in their occupational craft.	32
	The term <i>appropriate</i> in this context refers to being "suitable or proper" to the circumstance. The Superintendent must weigh all of these factors when recommending a budget for approval. While all points of view and corresponding input may not find their way into the recommended budget, it is still important to acknowledge that various positions and recommendations brought forth were considered for inclusion.

The Introductory Section of the 2020-21 Budget Book included the following information regarding the collection of input:

Collecting Input

School Board Executive Limitation 2.5.4 states that "There will be no financial plan that does not collect appropriate input from various sources". The process to build the proposed 2020-21 budget included the following input opportunities:

- 1. <u>School Board</u> The first official action that begins the process of budget development was the approval of the payable 2020 tax levy, which occurred on December 9, 2019. This levy includes approximately 22.7% of General Fund revenue. The board also provided guidance and input to the budget development process as follows:
 - January 6, 2020 Board workshop on 5-year financial model
 - January 27, 2020 Review budget timeline, discuss preliminary 2020-21 budget assumptions, 2019-20 Mid-year budget approval
 - March 23, 2020 Approved final 2020-21 budget assumptions, review proposed 2020-21 preliminary capital budget
 - April 27, 2020 Review proposed 2020-21 School Board budget
 - April 27, 2020 Approved 2020-21 capital budget
- 2. <u>Finance Advisory Committee</u> This committee of community members and staff reviews the assumptions included in the financial projection model. These assumptions and committee discussion provide important input into the budget development process.
- 3. <u>Principals</u> This group of leaders is essential to the budget development process. They provide input and shared decision making for budget adjustments, staffing and program needs.
- 4. <u>Community</u> The district website, email list and publications contained continuous updates regarding the budget development process including timeline, assumptions, and proposed adjustments. Community feedback is an essential part of assessing the final budget recommendation.
- 5. <u>Superintendent's Cabinet</u> This group meets weekly. Some part of the budget development process, including discussion of staff and community feedback, is on the agenda each week.

Statement of Assertion:

Board member's summarizing comments:

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Eden Prairie School Board Ends Policy Monitoring Process

The Board is accountable to the state and taxpayers for the District's performance. The Board is responsible for setting **Ends Policies** which state the results the Board expects to see accomplished for the District. These policies state what "good" is to be accomplished, for whom, at what cost.

The Superintendent is responsible for implementing the Ends Policies within specified Executive Limitations. One way the Board monitors district performance is by monitoring the **expected progress** toward achievement of the Ends Policies.

The Board monitors the Ends Policies in two phases, in accordance with Governance Process 4.2.3:

In June, prior to the upcoming school year, the Board monitors the Superintendent's **Operational Interpretation (OI)** of the Ends Policies, and whether the **evidence supports the OI**. (See below.)

In October, following the prior school year (Sept-June), the Board monitors the Superintendent's **assertion** of making **expected progress** toward achievement of the Ends Policies for that **prior** school year. (See below.)

Prior to the Upcoming School Year

Operational Interpretation (OI):

In June, prior to the upcoming school year, the Superintendent is responsible for drafting/editing an **Operational Interpretation (OI)** for each of the Ends Policies.

This OI includes the Superintendent's

Interpretation of the policy, with an explicit explanation

Justification for the reasonableness of the interpretation, and a

Measurement plan which supports the interpretation.

Following a motion, second and discussion, the Board votes whether the Superintendent's Operational Interpretation is **reasonable** or **not reasonable**.

If the OI is voted **reasonable**, the OI constitutes the basis for the Superintendent's assertion of **expected progress** toward achievement of the Ends.

Eden Prairie School Board Ends Policy Monitoring Process (cont'd.)

If the entire OI, or a portion of it, is voted **not reasonable**, further monitoring of the policy ceases, there is no vote on the evidence, and the Superintendent commits to bring back a revised OI for a revote, within a time period acceptable to the Board.

Sample Motions for the reasonableness of the Operational Interpretation:

"I move that the Operational Interpretation is reasonable" or

"I move that the Operational Interpretation is reasonable with the exception

of..." or

"I move that the Operational Interpretation is not reasonable"

Evidence: data that justifies the Superintendent's assertion of expected progress

If the Board votes that the Operational Interpretation is **reasonable**, the Board makes a motion, seconds, discusses and votes whether the measurement plan provides **evidence** which **supports** or does **not support** the Operational Interpretation.

If the evidence is voted as **supporting** the OI, it constitutes the data that justifies the Superintendent's **assertion of expected progress** toward achievement.

If the entire evidence, or a portion of it, is voted as **not supporting** the OI, the Superintendent commits to bring back revised evidence, within a time period acceptable to the Board, for a revote.

Sample Motions for the Evidence supporting the Operational Interpretation:

"I move that the Evidence **supports** the Operational Interpretation" or

"I move that the Evidence **supports** the Operational Interpretation **with the exception of...**" or

"I move that the Evidence does not support the Operational Interpretation"

Eden Prairie School Board Ends Policy Monitoring Process (cont'd.)

Following the End of the Prior School Year

Superintendent's assertion:

Following the end of the prior school year, the Superintendent drafts Ends Policies Monitoring Reports, and presents them to the Board in October of the current school year.

The Superintendent asserts that the evidence either **demonstrates expected progress** or **does not demonstrate expected progress** toward achievement of the Ends.

If the Superintendent asserts that the report **does not** demonstrate expected progress, the report should include a commitment as to when in the future the Board can expect the evidence to demonstrate expected progress. This may include a brief plan showing the Superintendent has a process in place. The Board does not "approve" the plan.

Board acceptance of Ends Policies Monitoring Reports:

Prior to a Board Meeting at which an Ends Policy will be monitored, the Superintendent sends his Monitoring Report with assertion to the Board. The Board may then ask **clarifying questions of the Superintendent**, but not offer an opinion, regarding the Superintendent's Ends Reports assertion.

Following a time for questions at the Board table, a motion is made, seconded and discussed, the Board votes to accept or not accept the Superintendent's monitoring report, with the assertion that the evidence either **demonstrates** or **does not demonstrate** expected progress toward achievement of the Ends Policy.

Sample Motions for Ends Policies Monitoring Reports:

"I move to **accept** the Superintendent's Report for Policy xx.xx with the assertion that the evidence **demonstrates** expected progress" or

"I move to **NOT accept** the Superintendent's Report for Policy xx.xx with the assertion that the evidence **demonstrates** expected progress" or

"I move to **accept** the Superintendent's Report for Policy xx.xx with the assertion that the evidence **does not demonstrate** expected progress"

Board Member tips for monitoring an Ends Policy Monitoring Report:

In the Operational Interpretation for a long-term End, look for what reasonableness will look like in stages.

Look for the use of rates, ratios, percentages, comparisons and trends over time.

Look for **verifiable evidence** of expected progress towards the achievement of Ends rather than the Superintendent's opinion or belief.

Look for evidence that the End is **actually being achieved**, rather than what is being done to try to achieve it.

If the Board votes that a policy did not demonstrate expected progress, the board should expect, within an agreed upon timeframe, the Superintendent to share the District's plan to achieve progress in the future

Superintendent tips for drafting Ends Policies Monitoring Reports:

Place raw numbers in context.

Provide the best evidence you have, even if not perfect, and discuss limitations. Identify a date by which better evidence will be available.


Summarize relevant evidence in key categories to provide "governance-friendly" information that gives evidence of expected progress and trends.

Make sure assertions are clearly visible in the report.

When asserting **not meeting expected progress toward achievement,** include a commitment as to when in the future the Board can expect the evidence to demonstrate expected progress, and a brief plan showing there is has a process in place.

- 2. I interpret the 21st Century Skills as Communication, Critical Thinking, Collaboration, and Creativity. These skills are incorporated into instruction at all levels. In Eden Prairie, the focus of 21st Century Skills is defined by the 4C's (critical thinking, creativity, collaborating, and communicating).

Justification:

Eden Prairie's strategic mission is to inspire each student to learn continuously so they are empowered to reach personal fulfillment and contribute purposefully to our ever-changing world. Our focus on "each" learner shows a commitment to the success of each individual student; that each learner's 41 needs are met so they may achieve personal and district expectations regardless of race, socio-economic group, or service group defined by the Minnesota Department of Education (MDE).

An integration of 21st century themes into daily learning experiences will guarantee and enhance high levels of learning in academic core content areas. The integration of 21st Century skills and content areas increases academic achievement by engaging students in authentic experiences replicating those they will encounter beyond their years in school. These experiences are designed to create transferable skills, preparing students to contribute purposefully to our ever-changing world.

In Eden Prairie, 21st Century skills is defined by the 4C's (critical thinking, creativity, collaborating, and communicating). Eden Prairie's interpretation of the 21st Century skills are defined as:

Communication

 Students will use effective interpersonal skills to build positive relationships and promote collaborative learning, including being able to communicate interactively and effectively to support individual learning and contribute to the learning of others. Students will communicate effectively in diverse environments showing cultural understanding and global awareness.

Critical Thinking

Students will be able to collect, assess, and analyze relevant information. Learners will be able to identify, define, and solve authentic
problems and reflect critically on learning experiences, processes, and solutions.

Collaboration

 Students will be able to demonstrate an ability to work effectively and respectfully with diverse teams, exercising flexibility through shared responsibility of collaborative work. Learners will develop attributes which value the individual contributions made by each team member and embody a willingness to make necessary compromises to accomplish a common goal.

Creativity

Students will be able to think creatively and develop new and worthwhile ideas. Learners will work creatively with others as they
develop, implement, and communicate new ideas. Students will demonstrate the courage to explore, while viewing failure as an
opportunity to learn.

Eden Prairie's implementation of this measurement is ongoing, and we will continue to make progress towards measuring each of the 4C's with all students. Student proficiency of the 4C's is measured through performance assessments embedded into content area assessments. The effective measurement of the 4C's requires the implementation of system-wide rubrics and a shift in teacher practice in the area of assessment. An annual review and update of this measurement plan will ensure long-term success and sustainable change.


