BOARD OF EDUCATION

MARCH 2022 MEETING UPDATES

The PPS Board of Education approved the Student Transfer Policy capacity revision. The vote was unanimous.


Per <u>PPS Board of Education policy regarding</u> student transfers, each school site's grade level capacity shall be approved by the board of education prior to the first day of January, April, July and October of each school year.

The bids for the Middle School of Piedmont construction project were tabled.

The PPS Board of Education convened to executive session to discuss employment items and a long-term suspension appeal.

After returning to open session, the board voted to approve the employment items on Attachment B of the board agenda. The vote was unanimous. The board also voted to uphold the suspension. This vote was unanimous, as well.

The PPS Board of Education approved the consent agenda, including the 2022 district lawn maintenance agreement with Busy Barrios, LLC. The vote was unanimous.







PUBLIC RELATIONS/COMMUNICATIONS

DISTRICT COUNSELING SERVICES

PIEDMONT ELEMENTARY

The D.R.E.A.M. team, a club for 4th-grade students, has started at PES. The Doing Reaching Encouraging And Mentoring team helped with the annual PES food drive February 28 - March 5. This group of students will also help welcome new students and plan future events for our school.

Calm Waters, which provides small group opportunities to help children cope with anxiety, anger, and family changes, is continuing at PES.

NORTHWOOD ELEMENTARY

In February, our team focused on Kindness lessons for all students. Our next focus areas are career lessons for all students, then we will shift to state testing coping skills lessons for students in grades 3 and 4.

MIDDLE SCHOOL OF PIEDMONT

The Middle School has implemented a weekly social skills lesson every Wednesday during advisory. Discussion topics this semester include: Goal Setting, Believing in Yourself, Wellness and Meditation, and lessons about Black History Month. Students have reached out with other topics to discuss in the next couple of months.

The enrollment process for the 22-23 school year has started. The Middle School has added new elective classes, including agriculture education, career exploration, and nutrition and wellness.

HEALTH & WELLNESS/SAFE SCHOOLS

District Nurse, Amy Siefke, is currently working on getting all PHS students CPR education. The goal is to provide all students with CPR education each year. Nurse Siefke is instructing a class each day during Advisory. A special CPR class will be held for all seniors to meet the graduation requirement.






DISTRICT COUNSELING SERVICES

PIEDMONT HIGH SCHOOL

Enrollment is underway for all current PHS students. The counselors at Piedmont High School have been meeting



with students to work through enrollment selections for the 2022-2023 school year. We have scheduled Enrollment Nights for PHS Parents on March 22 and March 24. Parents will meet with advisory teachers to sign off on student course selections and have the option of attending informational sessions on Advanced Placement Courses, Concurrent College Courses, Student Internships, Virtual Courses, and Canadian Valley Technology Center.

We had more than 130 students apply to CVTech this year!

Interviews were conducted in late February and students should know by spring break if they have been accepted. We are excited to learn CVTech has added a new Aviation Maintenance Program available to our students this coming fall.

After spring break, the PHS Counseling team will hit the ground running with the College & Career Readiness Assessment for our Juniors.

READING SUPPORT & INTERVENTION

The Reading Specialists are busy teaching Take Flight lessons to our students who display characteristics of dyslexia or other reading difficulties. These students have not responded to traditional interventions. All three Reading Specialists agree their Take Flight training has been the most transformative initiative for reaching all developing readers. They express their sincere appreciation for the training the district has provided to best serve all students.

The Reading Specialists are taking part in the state-funded LETRS training alongside several of our classroom teachers. LETRS teaches the skills needed to master the fundamentals of reading instruction—phonological awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, comprehension, writing, and language. This excellent program will greatly benefit all who participate. This team of professionals is eager to share knowledge gained during future PLC meetings and Professional Development. Cohorts 3 and 4 are upcoming and the team will encourage classroom teachers to enroll.

ELA curriculum adoption is well underway. Reading Specialists attended the textbook caravan where we were given a broad overview of current programs. We are meeting with the companies of the programs we thought looked the most comprehensive for our Piedmont students. Those meetings will give us a more in-depth look into the curriculum and how it will align with the needs of our students.

In the 2022-2023 school year, Oklahoma legislation will require all K-3 students who are not performing on grade level, based on the universal screener, to be given an additional assessment, using an approved dyslexia screener. We are in the process of carefully reviewing all options to make sure that what we pick is aligned with our assessment goals.

rLIBRARY-MEDIA PROGRAM



PHS Library-Media Specialist, Mrs. Nicci Francis, has assisted MSP ELA teachers to secure reading materials for their classrooms while their library is closed by utilizing Sora. Sora provides all district students access to ebooks and audiobooks from the PPS collection, the OK Virtual Library collection, and the Metropolitan Library System collection. The high school is also piloting two GALE databases this semester to assist students with research.

Mrs. Francis was also selected to the High School Sequoyah Reading Team, and has just started her three-year term. Her selection will allow us to secure thousands of dollars in new release books for our library collection, as well as effectively "book talk" the books in our collection to make appropriate recommendations for students. We are thrilled for this special selection and how it will benefit PHS students for years to come!

Piedmont Public Schools is proud to announce the selection of Madison Lake & Gracie Meade to the Oklahoma Foundation for Excellence Academic All-State class of 2022. These students were chosen to represent Piedmont with this prestigious academic recognition.

CURRICULUM & INSTRUCTION

Site and district administrators met with the Yukon Public Schools Assistant Superintendent and Instructional Technology Coach to learn about Mastery Connect as we transition to a new digital assessment management system to replace Performance Matters. We will select several teachers to pilot this program for the 4th quarter. We are researching and plan to pilot several programs before making a decision moving forward to next year.



Through our curriculum meetings, it had become evident that an online research database was needed at our secondary levels for students to conduct research. PHS is currently piloting Gale in Context which offers cross-curricular content that supports national and state curriculum standards and reinforces the development of skills such as critical thinking, problemsolving, communication, collaboration, creativity, and innovation. It supports exploring topics within business and economics, geography, government, history, literature, science and health, social issues, and more.

At our intermediate and middle school levels, we have purchased Britannica School which offers thousands of curated and curriculum-relevant articles, images, videos, audio clips, primary sources, maps, research tools, recommended websites, and three unique, but connected, databases to meet every reading level. Through these two programs, students can access thousands of different resources for research papers and essays in several different courses.

Our social studies Instructional Rescource Specialists and social studies curriculum team have spent significant time evaluating our elementary school social studies curriculum to ensure student success. We are working with several vendors to make a selection on a new program to best serve our students moving forward.

instruction & student services

The Professional Development and Technology Integration Committee met on February 25th to discuss and plan for the 2022-23 school year.

Takeaways from the February 25th meeting:

- We discussed the importance of training for student trauma and derealization, specifically regarding classroom management strategies backed by
- The committee would like training on best supporting our growing population of English language learners.
- The committee discussed the need to provide training for teachers on instructional practices below their teaching level to address the cognitive needs of students. Example: Training for upper-elementary grade teachers on reading strategies typically taught in lower-elementary grades to help students who are behind or need additional support to obtain proficiency in those areas.
- We began to work through a strategy to establish a district technology implementation plan to ensure students are presented with the same resources and skills by grade level at each academic interval.

Future items to be discussed at the March 21st meeting:

- Enhancing instruction by utilizing technology in the classroom, specifically regarding making the learning experience more student-produced vs. studentconsumed.
- Types of specific training for utilizing classroom SMART boards as a productive instruction tool
- Discussion on types of training for back-to-school inservice days
- Implementation of district technology plan

TECHNOLOGY INTEGRATION

Piedmont Public Schools works to ensure that all students are responsible and productive digital citizens in today's technology-driven world. At the elementary level, teachers are introducing technology to students with apps and programs that bring standards alive for students. Our youngest Wildcats maintain a balance between hands-on learning and digital exploration. Applications are used to differentiate lessons for each student, as well as provide the teacher with a reliable quick assessment tool. Each student in grades Pre-K to 1st grade have access to an iPad at school to utilize these applications. The upper elementary students, grades 2 to 4, make the transition from being consumers of technology to producers. These students move from an iPad to a school Chromebook, where they learn how to appropriately create a variety of resources using digital tools. For example, students may research a topic on Brittanica and use Google Slides to present their findings.

Our Learning Management System, Schoology, plays an important role at the secondary level. Students are able to access their assignments from various classes, message their teachers, as well as submit assignments from anywhere in the world that has internet access. Teachers enhance their lessons with interactive video lessons and hands-on digital labs that cannot be facilitated otherwise. Students use digital tools such as Google Suite and Screencastify to expand and showcase their understanding of lessons. Piedmont Public Schools are truly leading the way in Technology Integration.
