School Improvement Plan:

SIP was reviewed by Ms. Killpack. Math goal will score at district average or higher on all math end of level assessments. Reading goal is 60% of students making typical or better growth and increase composite score by 2%. SEL goal is academic achievement will improve with the implementation of the District's 5 competency SEL skills.

TSSA distribution was discussed. TSSA \$ was used to increase office hours, general supplies, and aides to help support learning, and VEX Robotics.

School Business:

September was a busy month. PTA had a movie night and raised \$ with donations and Valley View swag. Kindness week was implemented this month. Fun Run brought in just over 13K.

Question on why teachers counted money for Fun Run was asked as opposed to pulling in parental volunteers. School funds have to have 2 school personal when counting school fund money. An explanation on giving teachers and students a read-a-thon to help give teachers the time and as a way to reward students for participating in the Fun Run. When the money comes to the office, Abbey Hadley is the second school personal who counts the money again.

Falcon Football Night at Bountiful High was explained since drawing won't happen until Monday.

Halloween Parade: We are going to do a Halloween parade. Parents can bring chairs and set up outside in the back where parade will happen. (weather permitted) or the school will stream the parade. No mask, no weapons with costume!

End of term there has usually been a day that teachers could use to do grades. The district is using those days for the next 2 years so that teachers can participate in trainings.

Emergency Preparedness Plan change in where we evacuate. We will be evacuating to Millcreek Jr. High.

Data from Acadience BOY was discussed:

Kindergarten: 87% proficient

1st grade: 75% proficient

4th grade: 60% Proficient (w/o spectrum)

2nd grade: 84% proficient

5th grade: 70% Proficient (w/o spectrum)

3rd grade: 83% proficient

6th grade: 82% proficient (w/o/ spectrum)

LETRS training was discussed and explained why teachers are being required to take training.

Committee felt the year has started off great. Concerns were expressed about some transition staffing issues. Ms. Killpack feels confident in addressing them and in providing the support needed.

Community Business:
