- Be sure to arrive early and bring your photo ID.



Assessment

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Take the Placement Test

- Accuplacer Reading
 - Must place college level
 - Score good for 2 years (2 attempts*)
- Accuplacer English
 - Score good for two years (2 attempts*)
- ALEKS Math
 - Score good for 1 year (3 attempts*)

How to Qualify

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Alternative ways to qualify for Running Start

- Submit Smarter Balance Assessment Consortium Scores (SBAC).
 - Provide SBAC scores to Assessment Center.
- · College in the high school.
 - Submit official transcripts directly to CBC from appropriate college/university.



Running Start Application

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Complete a CBC Running Start admissions application

- If you qualify, you will receive a blue Running Start admissions application after your placement test.
- Submit your completed admissions application to Hawk Central (located in the H Building).
