Tip of the Weele: 25 ACT Math Concepts You Need to Know

- 21. A ratio expresses a mathematical comparison between two quantities. (1/4 or 1:4)
- 22. A proportion is an equation involving two ratios. ($\frac{1}{4} = x/8$ or 1:4=x:8)
- 23. When multiplying exponential expressions with the same base, add the exponents.t.
- 24. When dividing exponential expressions with the same base, subtract the exponents.
- 25. When raising one power to another power, multiply the exponents.

The most important reason teens should not have their phones at night.

The research is clear: When teenagers have screens in their bedroom, it interferes with their sleep. A study in the journal of the American Medical Association found that children ages 6 to 18 had an 88 percent higher risk of not sleeping enough when devices were in the bedroom and a 53 percent higher risk of getting a bad night's sleep when devices were in the bedroom just three nights a week.

The (AAP) found that sleeping with a cell phone next to you is worse than falling asleep with the TV on. Phones are addictive enough without having access to them 24 hours a day. Research shows that small breaks from screens can help to alleviate anxiety.

Create a contract with your teen regarding cell phone use.
