CCMS Quick Recall Team Wins Regional Governor's Cup

For the first time in history an academic team from Clinton County is a regional champion! On Saturday, February 2, 2019, the Clinton County Middle School academic team traveled to Pulaski County to compete in regional Governor's Cup competition. After a long day of matches, Clinton County emerged as the Quick Recall Tournament champions. This achievement tops an undefeated season for the CCMS Academic Team, who did not lose a match during the Lake Cumberland Academic

League held in October—December. They were also undefeated in both District and Regional Governor's Cup

competition. Two students from Clinton County also receive individual honors for written assessment. Loren

Little placed 1st in Language Arts and Evan Little placed 1st in Arts & Humanities. The entire academic team, as well as those students receiving individual honors, will now advance to State Governor's Cup competition to be held in Louisville on March 16-18.

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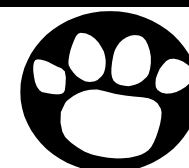

Six families enrolled in the Clinton County Migrant Education Program attended the Kentucky State Police Trooper Island

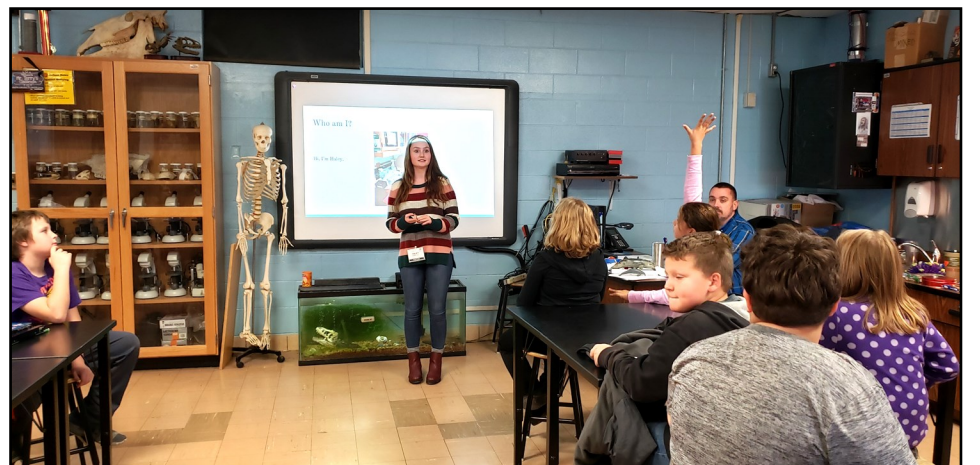
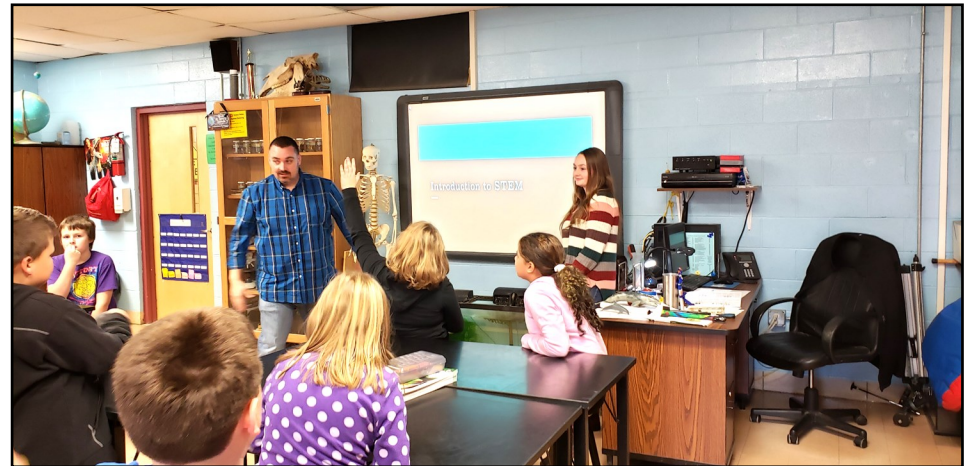
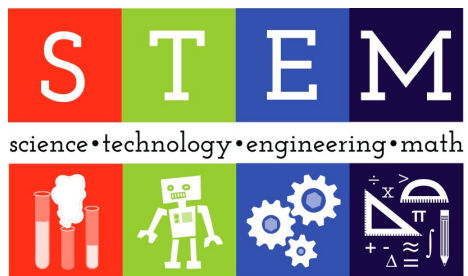
Christmas luncheon on December 22, 2018. After lunch the children enjoyed a visit from Santa. The children received gifts, and the

On Saturday, January 19, 2019, the Clinton County Middle School hosted the 46th District KAAC Governor's Cup competition. The Clinton County Middle School Academic Team placed 1st overall, winning the District tournament. The team placed 1st in Quick Recall and 1st in Future Problem Solving. Several students won individual awards for

written assessment as well. Evan Little placed 1st and Emma Tompkins placed 3rd in Arts and Humanities. Loren Little placed 1st, Alex Duvall placed 3rd, and Ella Rose Smith placed 5th in Language Arts. Malachi Upchurch placed 4th in Mathematics. Caleb Marcum placed 2nd and Tyler Guffey placed 3rd in Science. Ryan Bair placed 1st and Emma Tompkins placed

2nd in Social Studies. Ashton Daniels placed 2nd and Valarie Latham placed 4th in Composition. The team also received the Hume Sportsmanship Award, voted on by all of the participating schools. The entire team advanced to the 12th Region KAAC Governor's Cup competition on February 2, 2019, where they won 1st in Quick Recall and 2nd place overall.

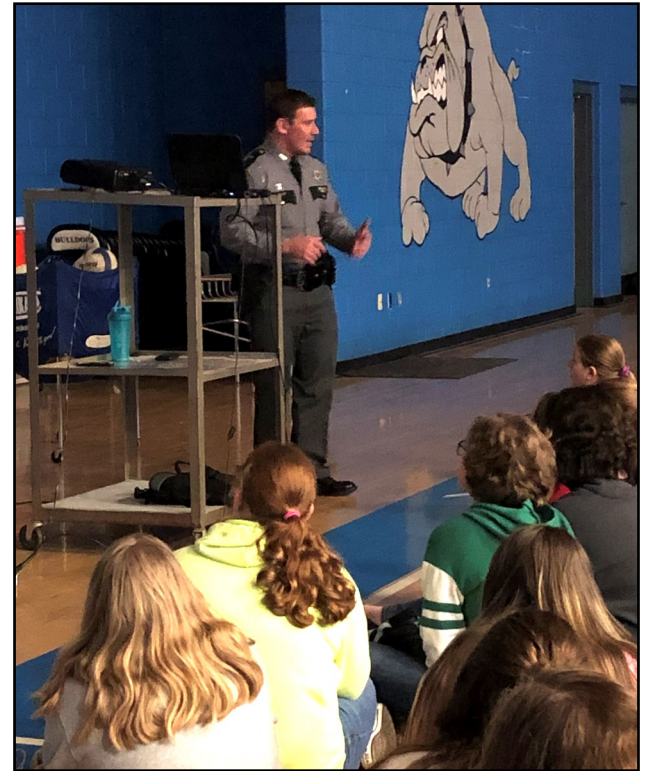
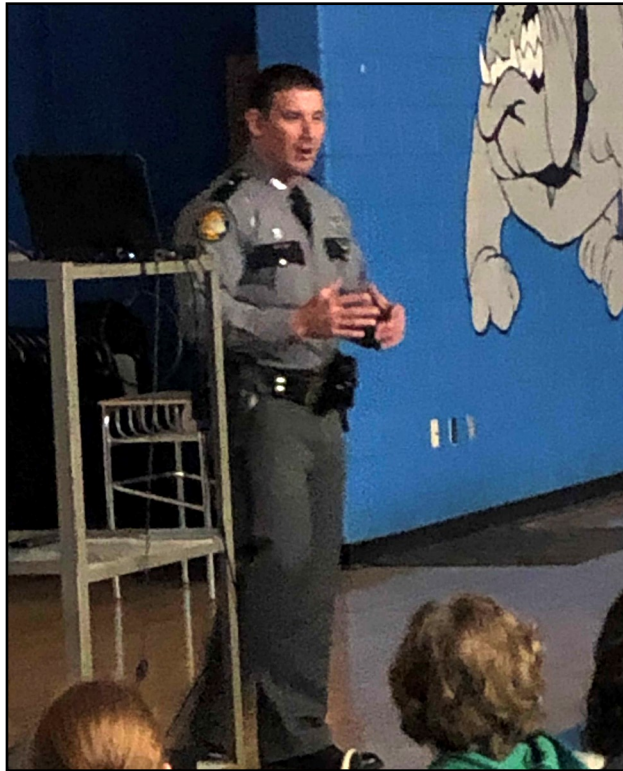


KSP Nick Hale Visits CCMS

Harlan Attends Governor's Scholars

Clinton County High School senior Jackson Harlan was selected to attend the Governor's Scholars Program with over 340 other Scholars at the Northern Kentucky University campus from June 24 - July 28, 2018. Scholars attended classes in a learning friendly environment during the weekdays with events and activities at nights and on weekends.

The Governor's Scholars Program is a summer residential program for outstanding high school students in Kentucky who are rising seniors. The program originated in 1983 as a

result of Kentucky leaders' concern that the state's "best and brightest" were leaving the Commonwealth to pursue educational and career opportunities elsewhere without fully understanding the potential of their talents at home. The Program's mission is to enhance Kentucky's next generation of civic and economic leaders. The first class numbered 230 and was housed on one college campus. Since then, the Program has enjoyed excellent support and grown to over 1,000 students on three campuses.

CCHS freshman and varsity boys basketball teams brought home the 1st place trophies in the 16th district tournament.

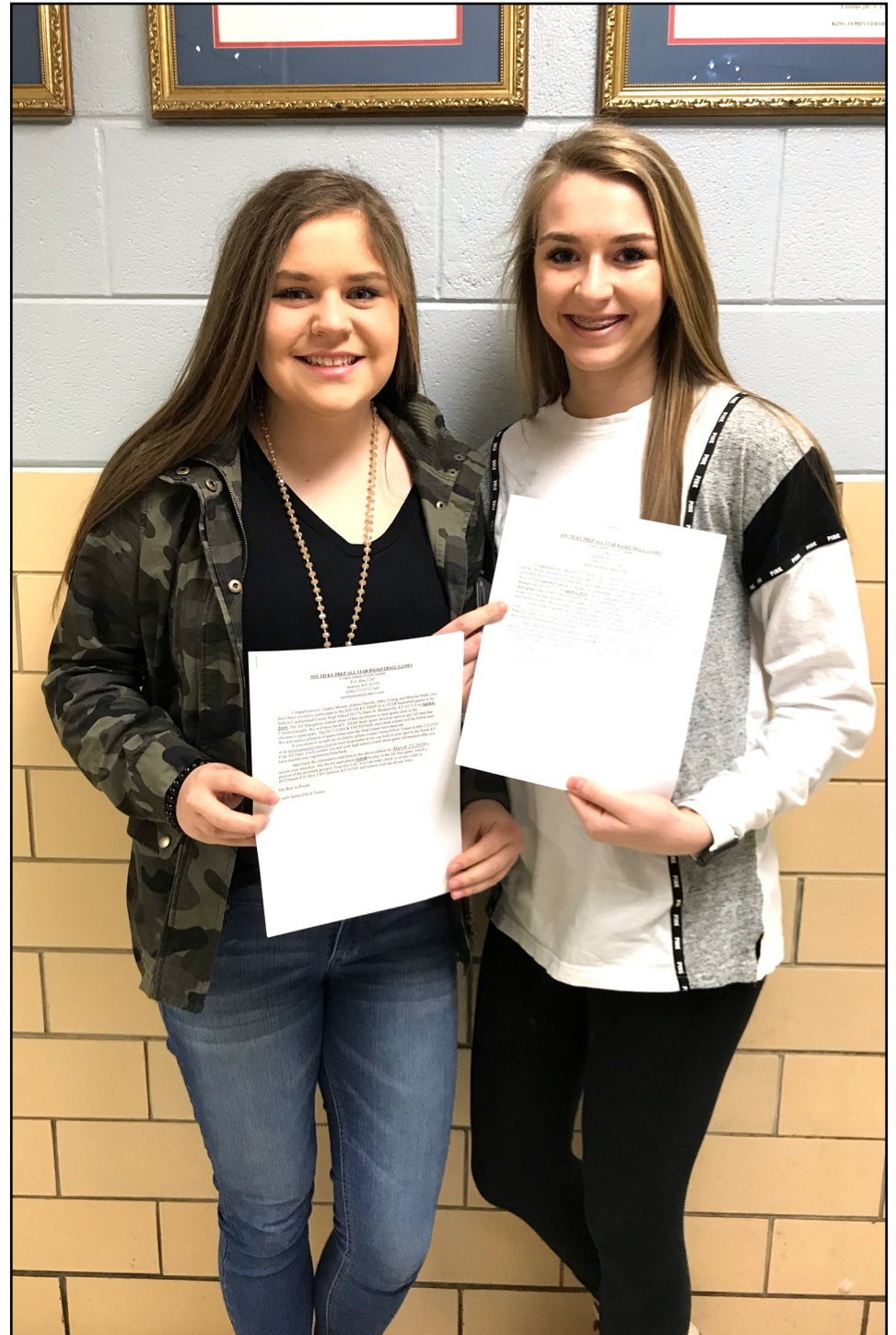
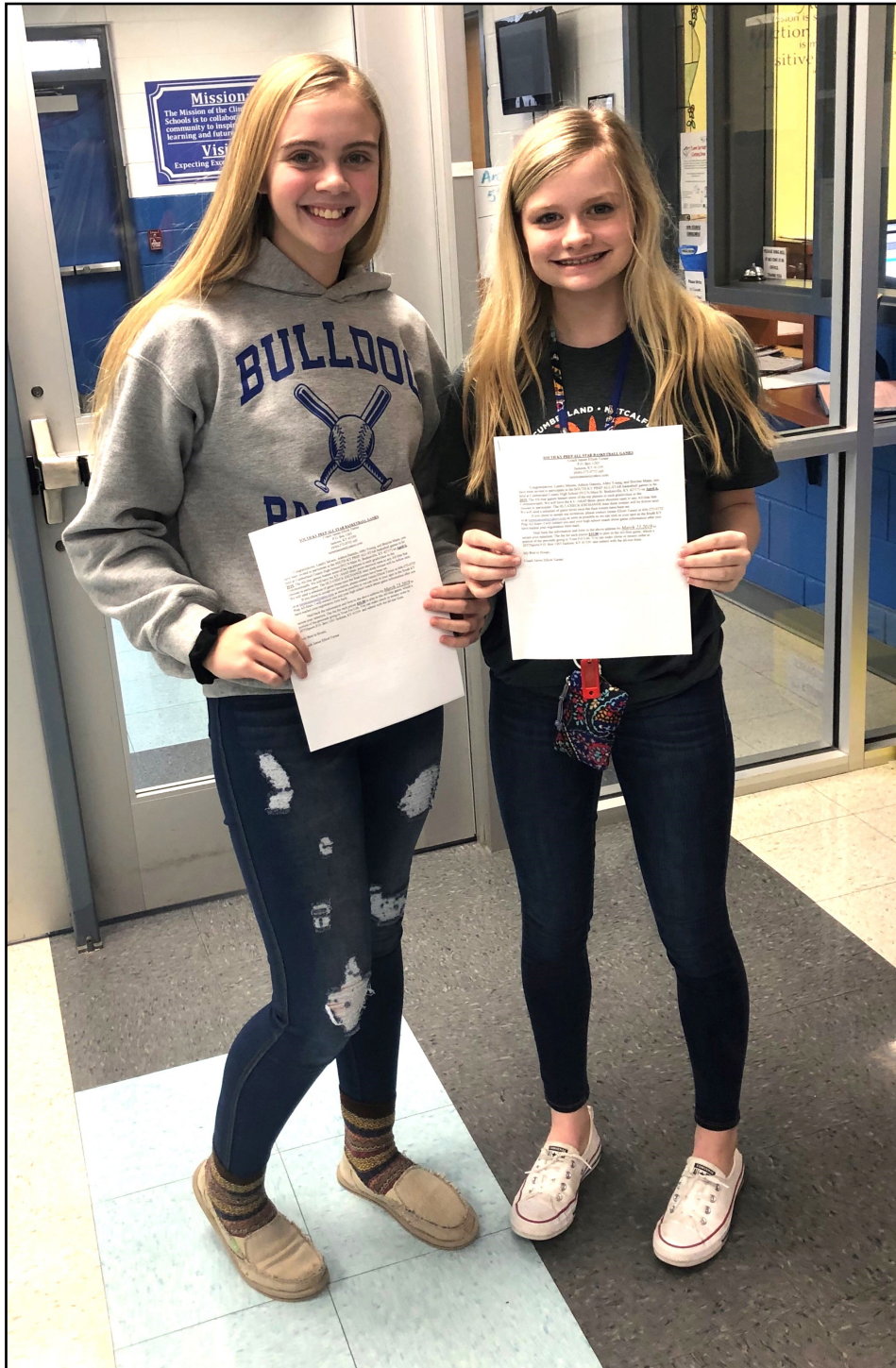


Lady Bulldogs to Play in All-Star Games
