After a long day of matches, Clinton County emerged as the Quick Recall Regional Tournament champions. This achievement tops an undefeated season for the CCMS Academic Team, who did not lose a match during the Lake Cumberland Academic League held in October—December. They were also undefeated in both District and Regional Governor's Cup





competition. Two students from Clinton County also receive individual honors for written assessment. Loren


UK Student Talks STEM at AES














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Mr. Science Visits AES

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
