Swim or get wet daily

Partners 'N Pals kids swim daily. Swimming occurs in public pools. The following is helpful in making swimming a fun experience,

- Swimsuits need to be modest and durable
- ⇒ 1 piece for girls or tankini that covers stomach
- \Rightarrow No speedos for boys
- No cutoffs
- Swimsuits must be lined—Swimming pools require all boys swimsuits to have a liner

Stipends for Partners N Pals

Stipends vary depending on positions and length of service. Only one, three (3) day can be counted towards the commitment.

Each Summer Camp counselor will receive a stipend based on their contract agreement. If during the camp you would like to extend your contract a week please talk to the Site Director.

Stipend checks are mailed two weeks out after completion of time and submittal of the essay.

Partners 'N Pals camp is

- \$325 for 3 week commitment
- \$425 for 4 week commitment
- \$525 for 5 week commitment

Training

The Arc of Tri-Cities Camp provides a thorough orientation and continuous training for the program. Volunteer Summer Camp Counselors will be trained on how to work with individuals who have special needs – to include child development, hygiene and personal care, behavior management, disability information, and camp policies and procedures.

Training is mandatory for all new and returning volunteers. Training Dates include:

When will I know if I have been accepted?

Volunteer Summer Camp Counselors who interview by May 24th will know May 30th if they have been accepted. If you interview after May 24th we will be notified by June 5th.

All applicants will be interviewed and eligibility determined prior to camp training dates.

All applicants will be interviewed and eligibility determined prior to camp training dates.
