Covid Update

As a reminder we are still operating at a high level of alert within the school environment and are awaiting further details. All schools continue to implement the advice on use of face coverings for the 'high' risk level for staff, visitors and pupils in Nant in communal areas (not classrooms). Face coverings must be worn on home to school transport. Staff and Nant pupils are still strongly advised to take the LFD test twice a week before attending school to report their result online and let us know. This needs to take place on a Monday and a Wednesday, please report a Covid absence on 436171 option 1. Tests are available from school - see Miss Hooper.

Ukraine

Many thanks to all the families who have supported our collection for Ukraine this week so far. Due to demand/feedback we have extended this collection to next Wednesday. We are collecting nappies, wipes, toiletries, batteries, hats/gloves, torches, thermal clothing, thermos flasks, rain coats, new underwear, toothpaste/brushes, hairbrushes, medicine, first aid kits, energy bars, sanitary products, sleeping bags and emergency blankets. These items can be dropped in bags at the main reception. The Pupil Leadership Team (PLT) will be selling hand-made blue and yellow ribbons later next week, which pupils will be able to wear at all times if they wish. The ribbons will be 50p.


St Davids Day
