

- Window film was completed in 2020
- IDF Rooms were completed in 2020


H.E. McCracken Middle School:

- Window film was completed in 2020
- IDF Rooms were completed in 2020
- Bleachers were completed in 2020
- Installation of new field lights were completed in January 2021

Hilton Head Island High School:

- Rain in February 2021 has resulted in minor delays
- Installation of new stadium lights are 75% complete; Completion to occur in March 2021

#### Whale Branch Elementary and Whale Branch Middle School (Rosenblum Coe Architects, Inc./Contract Construction)



#### **Status Flag Comments:**

Required Contingency Use of \$154,936 on 6-10-2020; See 2019
 Referendum Project Contingency Log for details

Whale Branch Elem. and Whale Branch Middle School:

- Window film and new IT Rooms have been completed
- BDA installation completed; Testing to occur when emergency generator is installed (est. Q3 2021)
- Cable tray installations are 66% complete

Whale Branch Middle School:

- Demolition of locker rooms was completed in February 2021
- Ductwork, wood floor and bleachers have been ordered
- New security vestibule scheduled to start construction in Q2 2021

- Reduce Scope as required to assure cost control for year 3-4 projects

### Financial Update

- All budgeted dollars for the projects equal the dollars approved by the referendum.
- The 11-30-20 appropriation amounts per project did not change from the initial budget at 2-28-20
- Any individual budget that was adjusted was supported by the referendum contingency.
- The dollars spent and encumbered did not exceed the budgeted project total.
- The dollars spent per project did not exceed the estimated project percent completed.
