

In January, we will be administering Reading Inventory assessments and Curriculum Based Assessments with our students in grades 2-5.

Reading Inventory is a research-based, adaptive student assessment program designed to evaluate students' reading abilities, monitor student reading progress, set goals for reading growth, and match students to books at appropriate reading levels.

Curriculum Based Assessments are a form of standardized assessment of academic achievement. It is an evaluation process that makes use of academic content selected directly from the material being taught to the student. It connects evaluation with instructional programs by informing teachers of both student progress and learning challenges.

The valuable information we gain from the assessments will help guide our instructions so we can better meet students' needs.

#### Service

The PBIS committee meets each month to look over discipline data and talk about the school wide Triple R program and how we can improve things. The data so far this year is indicating many students are struggling to show kindness and get along with others. Recess incidents are on the rise and we are surprised by the lack of patience and tolerance that some students are demonstrating. Coming off a school year when social interaction was at a minimum is certainly playing a part in the behaviors we are seeing. Teachers and staff are working hard to remind students to show kindness, and to problem solve concerns in a peaceful way. #### **December's Grade Level Spotlight**

#### **Second Grade:**

<u>ELA</u>: We will look for the central theme and supporting details in the texts we read. We will work on spelling sight words correctly and adding more details to our writing pieces. We will discuss and write paragraphs about how and why a character's feelings change throughout a story.

<u>Math</u>: We will use ten frames, number lines and place value resources to add and subtract fluently within 100. We will look at number patterns. We will solve problems using information from bar graphs.

<u>Social Studies</u>: We will be exploring our community at work. We will learn about natural, capital and human resources. We will look at assembly lines and how they make production quicker.

### CCPS Inclement Weather Policy

When inclement weather conditions occur, the decision may be made to delay the opening of school by one or two hours, to close school, or to dismiss school early. An announcement will be made for delayed openings or closing by 6:00 a.m. Every effort will be made to make the announcement as early as possible. The complete CCPS Inclement Weather Policy can be found here.

There may be an announcement made to open schools 2 hours late with a "re-evaluation" period to possibly close schools. If no re-evaluation announcement is made by 7:00 a.m., schools will open 2 hours late as originally announced.

All weather-related announcements will be made through the CCPS's School Messenger system, the school website <a href="www.carrollk12.org">www.carrollk12.org</a>, and CETV-Channel 21, as well as through local and regional media.

PLEASE NOTE: When schools are closed all day OR closed early, there will be no after school or evening events. This includes clubs, tutoring, meetings, planned special events, performances, and any Use of Facility arrangements.
