

We will spend a day hiking at the Laurentian Divide which is known by the Ojibwe as the "Hill of Three Waters." We will investigate how water from this hilltop can travel to Hudson Bay, Lake Superior, or the Mississippi River which eventually reaches the Gulf of Mexico!

We will travel to Superior, Wisconsin to board the Blue Heron. This working research vessel, operated by the University of Minnesota-Duluth, will be docked and waiting for us on Lake Superior. We will have the opportunity to conduct lab tests and work beside UMD's scientists. (Unfortunately, K-12 students are not allowed to leave the safety of the dock) For more information about this incredible experience on the Blue Heron, be sure to check out the website:
