## **Graduation Day Preferred Parking & Handicap Parking**

With Graduation Day fast approaching, it is time to consider getting "Graduation Day" Preferred Parking to make attending the ceremony an easy process. As tradition would have it, Live Oak Grad Night is managing this fundraiser to help support the cost of the grad night event for seniors.

#### **Preferred Parking**

Preferred parking includes the parking spaces in the Student Parking Lot closest to the football field where the graduation ceremony will be held. These spaces start at the beginning of the tennis courts and extend to the football field. The cost is \$25 per parking space and your space will be reserved so that you don't need to arrive extra early to the ceremony.

#### Handicap Parking

Handicap parking will be free of charge to anyone in need, but you must fill out and submit the form in advance, so we know how many spaces to reserve. A California DMV Handicap Placard is required.

#### **General Parking**

All general parking spaces on campus (including the remaining spaces in the student lot and teachers parking lot) will require a parking fee of \$5 on the day of the ceremony when entering the lots and will be provided on a first-come first-served basis. All proceeds will benefit the Safe & Sober Grad Night!

To reserve your Preferred Parking space(s), complete the form below, detach it and put it in an envelope with a **check (payable to LOSSGN) or cash in the amount of \$25**. Please put your first and last name and "Preferred Parking" on the envelope. Then have your student drop off the envelope in the Grad Night Box located in the ASB Office. Or parents can mail the envelope to PO Box 26, San Martin, CA 95046.
