# 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Classes



1. English - Prep or Honors
  2. Math - Usually Math 1P, Math 1Honors or Math 2/3Honors
  3. Science - Physics or Conceptual Physics
  4. PE or a Sport
  5. Additional Courses including Health/Ethnic Studies
- All 9th graders take 4 classes per Term so they will have 16 courses listed

# Graduation Requirements



- High School Graduation Requirements
  - 220 credits
  - 60 hours of community service
- A-G (UC/CSU eligibility requirements)

# Community Service



- 60 hours required for high school graduation.
- 200 needed for Community Service Excellence Award.
- Community Service hours start the day after 8th grade promotion.

- 7** Mandatory Student Fees:
- Enrollment Fees ( per unit) Waived
  - Health Fee \$22
  - Transportation Fee ( 6+ units) \$32
  - Transportation Fee ( 6 units or less) \$31
  - Books and Course Materials is the students responsibility

# SBCC DUAL ENROLLMENT



- What is Dual Enrollment?
  - HS students can take college-level classes; HS and college credit
  - Academic and Career Technical Courses: at HS, SBCC, Online
- Summer 2022 (Session 2: 6/27-8/6)
  - Summer Registration: April 18th
  - JH counselor can help complete steps for enrollment found on the SBCC Dual Enrollment page
- Fall 2022 Registration for classes at SBCC - July 5th
  - *If you are taking a SBCC class on the SBHS campus in the Fall you will do the registration with your class in the Fall.*

## State Seal of Biliteracy



- In order to be eligible for the State Seal of Biliteracy, students must meet all of the following criteria:
  1. Complete all English language arts requirements for graduation with an overall grade point average of 2.0 or above in those classes.
  2. Pass the California standards assessment at the “standards met” or above in English language arts (ELA). The test for native English speakers is administered in the 11th grade.
  3. Demonstrate proficiency in one or more languages—in addition to English

# CSU/UC “A-G” Minimum Admission Eligibility

<b>C. Math</b>	3+ years or 6+ semesters (Must include completion of CC Math III)
<b>D. Science</b>	2+ years or 4+ semesters (Must be a laboratory science in at least two of three areas: Biology, Chemistry, or Physics)
<b>E. Language Other than English</b>	2+ years or 4+ semesters of a Language Other Than English (LOTE). (Courses must be in the same language, ASL is allowed).
<b>F. Visual/Performing Art</b>	1 year or 2 semesters
<b>G. Electives</b>	1 year or 2 semesters college prep elective from list
<b>Ethnic Studies</b>	n/a
<b>Physical Education*</b>	n/a
<b>Health Science*</b>	n/a
<b>Other requirements</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Applicants to UC/CSU are not required to submit ACT or SAT scores. Students are no longer required to take the SAT Essay or ACT Writing Test.</li> <li>High school-level coursework completed in 7th and/or 8th grade can be used to meet the area C and/or E requirements.</li> </ul>

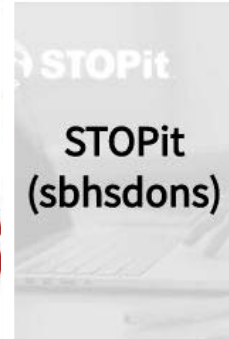
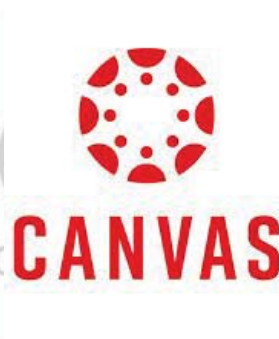

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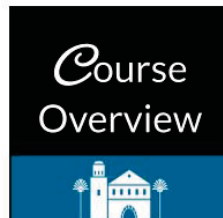
