SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Founded in 1970, St. Brendan High School is an archdiocesan high school in Miami, Florida whose first objective is to provide secondary Catholic education for young women and men in grades 9 through 12. Students of Hispanic descent comprise 93% of our student population. Female students comprise 65% of our student body, while male students make up 35%. Forty-eight percent of our student population is on some form of financial assistance. The students at St. Brendan High School are served by administrators, school counselors, and 82 instructors. The majority of them hold either a Masters, Specialists, or Doctoral degree. St. Brendan High School is an AP Capstone school, STEM certified by AdvancED/SACS-CAS1, and accredited by AdvancED/SACS-CAS1.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

St. Brendan is the only Catholic high school in South Florida offering a comprehensive Academies Program. Academies work similar to college majors, with students enrolling in one of four programs that focus on specific areas:

Medical

STEM

Law and Global Business

Visual and Performing Arts

St. Brendan offers the Alpha Program for students who have demonstrated high achievement and the Champagnat Program for students with special learning needs. St. Brendan offers an International Program for students from select European Schools. These students are paired with host families and enroll at the school for one marking period in the fall. St. Brendan also offers four world languages: Spanish, French, Italian, and Chinese. St. Brendan utilizes a semester academic calendar. Seven credits per semester is the maximum course load. The academic program is organized on a full block schedule, as follows:

Monday – Periods 1 – 7 Tuesday and Thursday – Periods 1 – 4 Wednesday and Friday – Periods 5 – 7

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students must earn a range of credits between 25 - 28 credits, maintain a 2.0 un-weighted grade point average on a 4.0 scale, and earn 100 hours of community service learning. Students must earn:

English – 4 credits Mathematics – 4 credits Theology – 4 credits Science – 3 credits Social Sciences – 3 credits World Languages – 2 credits Personal Fitness and Health – 1 credit Fine Art – 0.5 credit Computer Science – 0.5 credit

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Students are required to fulfill a minimum of 25 hours of community service per year, with a graduation requirement of 100 hours. There is no limit to the number of hours students can earn. Every graduating class, on average, complete approximately 65,000 hours of community service learning. In the second semester, students must present a project outlining their community service learning experience in conjunction with the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. St. Brendan High School's Community Service Learning Program is intended not simply as an exercise in the satisfaction of a certain number of hours of service to the community, but rather is intended to help students learn from service in a real and meaningful way, and grow in their faith.
