Cybercitizenship

Everyone who interacts online is a citizen of cyberspace. As young people learn to navigate cyberspace in increasingly complex ways, it is imperative to teach them the tools of good cybercitizenship.

Cybercitizenship is more than just having the technical capacity to use technology. It also includes having the skills to critically evaluate material found online, protect personal or identifying information, practice courteous and responsible behavior towards other cybercitizens, and manage potentially risky or dangerous situations. In this way, young people are better equipped to maximize the benefits and minimize the risks of technology use.
