

COURSE REQUEST GUIDELINES BY FORM/DEPARTMENT

The Academic Counselors, along with Department Chairs and the Director of Studies, will determine placement in Honors/AP level courses.

FOURTH FORM

ENGLISH

All Fourth Form students are enrolled in American Voices or Honors American Voices.

All newly enrolled English Language Learners will be assessed upon arrival to campus in the fall and be appropriately placed in an English course.

HISTORY AND SOCIAL SCIENCES

All Fourth Form students are enrolled in World History, Honors World History, or AP World History.

LANGUAGE

Canterbury offers French, Latin, and Spanish. If you have not studied this language previously, you will be enrolled in Level 1. All new students planning to take either French or Spanish should complete the placement test, located on the opening of school webpage. Instructions are included on the test. Students planning to take Latin will be evaluated upon arrival to campus in the fall.

MATH

Indicate the math course you think you should be enrolled in. **All new students** will take a placement test, located on the opening of school webpage. Instructions are included on the test.

SCIENCE

Fourth Form students are encouraged to take a year-long science. Options include: Biology, Honors Biology, Chemistry, Honors Chemistry, and electives. Read the Academic Guide for course options and the terms of the course offerings.

STUDIO AND PERFORMING ARTS

All Canterbury graduates are required to earn one credit in Studio and Performing Arts. Read the Academic Guide for course options and the terms of the course offerings.

DIGITAL COMMUNICATION, DESIGN AND INNOVATION

Canterbury graduates are not required to take a Digital Communication, Design and Innovation course. Courses may be taken as an elective. Read the Academic Guide for course options and the terms of the course offerings. As noted in the Academic Guide, select courses in this department satisfy the Studio and Performing Arts requirement.

THEOLOGY

All Fourth Form students are enrolled in Theology IV.
