

COURSE REQUEST GUIDELINES BY FORM/DEPARTMENT

The Academic Counselors, along with Department Chairs and the Director of Studies, will determine placement in Honors/AP level courses.

SIXTH FORM/POST GRADUATES

ENGLISH

All Sixth Form/Post Graduate students are required to take a full year of English. Make sure to select both a fall and spring semester course if not taking AP English Literature. Read the Academic Guide for course options and the terms of the course offerings.

All newly enrolled English Language Learners will be assessed upon arrival to campus in the fall and be appropriately placed in an English course.

HISTORY AND SOCIAL SCIENCES

Sixth Form/Post Graduate students are encouraged to take a full year of history and social sciences. Read the Academic Guide for course options and the terms of the course offerings.

LANGUAGE

Canterbury offers French, Latin and Spanish. All new students planning to take either French or Spanish should complete the placement test, located on the opening of school webpage. Instructions are included on the test. Students planning to take Latin will be evaluated upon arrival to campus in the fall.

Sixth Form/Post Graduate students who have completed Level 3 of at least one language are not required to take a language course, but are encouraged to continue to Level 4 or above.

Sixth Form/Post Graduate students are not permitted to be enrolled in Level 1 courses.

MATH

Indicate the math course you think you should be enrolled in. **All new students** will take a placement test, located on the opening of school webpage. Instructions are included on the test.

SCIENCE

All Sixth Form/Post Graduate students are encouraged to take a full year of science. Students who have already taken Biology and Chemistry should enroll in Physics, AP Physics 1 or electives. Read the Academic Guide for course options and the terms of the course offerings.

Two credits of lab sciences are required to graduate from Canterbury.

STUDIO AND PERFORMING ARTS

All Canterbury graduates are required to earn one credit in Studio and Performing Arts. Read the Academic Guide for course options and the terms of the course offerings.

DIGITAL COMMUNICATION, DESIGN AND INNOVATION

Canterbury graduates are not required to take a Digital Communication, Design and Innovation course. Courses may be taken as an elective. Read the Academic Guide for course options and the terms of the course offerings. As noted in the Academic Guide, select courses in this department satisfy the Studio and Performing Arts graduation requirement.

THEOLOGY

All Sixth Form students are required to take a full year of theology. Make sure to select both a fall and spring semester course. Read the Academic Guide for course options and the terms of the course offerings.
