

Dear Friends,

During the Easter Season, we hear at Mass the readings taken from the Acts of the Apostles. It is a great gift to the Church throughout the ages that St. Luke was inspired to record so much of the activity and development of the newly established Church.

This past Tuesday, the first reading for

daily Mass was taken from the Acts of the Apostles. The first sentence made the amazing claim, "The community of believers was of one heart and mind, and no one claimed that any of his possessions was his own, but they had everything in common."

In the Church today, we don't require everyone to forgo all of their possessions. However, this is the case for men and women who join religious orders and take a vow of poverty.

Although this spirit of detachment provides a strong witness, I think the first part of the quote from the Acts of the Apostles is even more remarkable: "The community of believers was of one heart and mind." Some theologians would say that this statement was setting forth an ideal which was not always realized but one the early Church tried to attain.

As we read the Acts of the Apostles, we see that things were not always peaceful among the believers. I think of one time when St. Paul was not seeing eye to eye with St. Peter concerning Gentile converts. Nonetheless, it is always good to strive for unity. Still, we should not always seek peace at any price. True unity requires humility and listening to another person with the desire to understand their reasoning, even if in the end we will still disagree. Remember in the Prayer of St. Francis, it states, "May I not so much seek to be understood as to understand."

I think we need to start by wanting to love, respect and understand the other person. This comes as the fruit of prayer. May we ask the Holy Spirit to help us to be in love and in union with one another.

Maybe we lack unity with those in our family, at work, in our neighborhood, or elsewhere. No matter where we find disunity, the Lord wants us to experience unity. Let us pray for more love, wisdom, humility and courage. They all can play an important role in bringing about a oneness of mind and heart.

Even though there were struggles in the early church, the believers aimed for a unity that was rooted in Christ. In the Old Testament, the prophet Micah writes: "What is good has been explained to you, man; this is what God asks of you: only this, to act justly, to love tenderly and to walk humbly with your God." (Micah 6:8) If we make this our goal, I believe we will be reflecting the early Church who often lived their lives with one mind and heart.

Bird's Eye View with Fr. Pellican



It's hard to believe that it has been nearly two years since I was ordained a priest. The time has flown by. The spring of 2020 was a joyful and grace-filled time for myself and the other four men ordained that year. I think about this as we approach spring this year,

when there will be no priestly ordinations for our diocese. This is the first time in generations the Archdiocese of Detroit (AOD) will have no ordinations. And this is just one symptom of the shortage of priestly vocations we are currently experiencing. Right now, there are 22 Detroit seminarians studying for the priesthood; when I entered in 2012 there were over 40. Many priests are nearing retirement. Many are past retirement but still serving as pastors because there is great need. We are blessed at Divine Child right now to be sheltered from this shortage, but that cannot continue forever. The best estimates indicate that in 10 years, we will have approximately half the number of priests currently serving in the AOD. These are sobering facts to which we cannot turn a blind eye.

In response to this shortage, Archbishop Vigneron called for all of us in the AOD to join him in a year of prayer for priestly vocations in our archdiocese. This Year of Prayer will begin on June 4, the vigil of Pentecost. The Archbishop will lead a Holy Hour at the Cathedral at 10:00am, when priestly ordinations would have ordinarily taken place. Here are a few words from his Homily at the Chrism Mass when he first called for this year of prayer. He writes the following:

We must face squarely the great sadness of our not having in this local church of Detroit sufficient priests for our share in the Holy Spirit's work of making the Passover of Jesus present. In less than a decade, we will have approximately fewer than half the number of priests serving this mission of grace. This fact is underscored by another, that this spring for the first time in generations, there will be no men ordained to the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Detroit. As a Church on mission, called to proclaim the paschal mystery of Jesus, we cannot be blind to this challenge. So as a response, as disciples of Jesus, we must begin with prayer, for he has charged us from the beginning: "Ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest," for "the harvest is abundant, and the laborers are few."

Today I'm blessed to announce an archdiocesan wide year of prayer for priestly vocations. We know that the Lord is calling men to share his priestly ministry. He never ceases to call men to be his coworkers. So we pray that more of those called will hear this invitation, listen with open hearts, and respond generously and courageously to the challenge of becoming fishers of men in the power of the Holy Spirit.

We will be answering the archbishop's call to prayer here at Divine Child in many ways over the next year. I invite you to pray for something even more specific. Pray that we would have many priestly vocations from our own parish of Divine Child, that the young men of our parish whom the Lord is calling - and we can be confident that He is calling - will have the courage to respond. The facts are sobering, but we remain confident in the Lord's providence and His promise to care for His Church till the end of time. "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:37-38). 

LET MI KIDS LEARN Petition Drive



LET KIDS LEARN. EVERY STUDENT. EVERY BACKGROUND. EVERY COMMUNITY.

Now is the time to support Michigan's low-income students (in both public and nonpublic schools), to give parents more control, and to provide additional educational opportunities. The **Michigan Catholic Conference, on behalf of the Catholic Bishops of Michigan**, supports this <u>nonpartisan</u> effort, which is why we can circulate the petitions in Catholic churches and schools.

What The Proposal Does

- Creates "student opportunity scholarships" to low-income families for their outof-pocket educational expenses. Scholarship Organizations would provide funds to qualifying public and nonpublic school students for tutoring, school supplies, computers, and tuition among other expenses.
- Creates a state tax credit for donations to scholarship organizations, including existing Catholic school foundations.

With 340,000 signatures, the Legislature can pass these two measures without requiring the signature of the governor, who unfortunately vetoed similar bills last fall.

- Volunteer to help with the Signature Drive.
- Prayerfully consider signing the two petitions to create the scholarship program and the tax credit.




All fiber art enthusiasts are welcome to join us on the 1st & 3rd Thursdays of the month.




