ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

A. Principal's Report

Mrs. Avery updated the School Board on enrollment 166 students with 162 in-person learners and 4 Virtual; Mrs. Avery highlighted the following: Employees of the Month – Mrs. Sanborn & Mrs. Perry; Fun Run Club – 15 members over 4 weeks, culminating activity 5K Pumpkin Run; Open House was held on October 16 and was successful; AES presented a check for \$330 to Squam Lakes Association, funds were raised through Jeans for a Cause, last winter, Squam Lakes Association provided during Winter Recreation – "Walk on the Wild Side: Winter Animal Track & Signs"; Halloween Parade was a success; Title I Committee established which includes Parents, will build community connections and activities for families; Grade 8 held in October a calendar raffle to raise funds for their class trip; November – Student Council holding a food drive; Grade 8 will take the PSATs on November 9, the results help to inform

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course selections at Plymouth Regional High School; Online Book Fair on November 9; Mathalon Meet on November 17; Parent Conferences on November 22; Term ends November 23; Student Council making approximately 20 wreaths this year with the Ashland Garden Club on December 1, the wreaths are made as thank you gifts for the donations for the Halloween Parade; Jeans for a Cause will be Operation Santa Claus.

B. Student Assessment and Student Progress Report

Mrs. Avery provided assessment results from the end of last school year and this fall. See attached table. Mrs. Guinan, Academic Interventionist, Mrs. Paul, Title I Teacher, and Mrs. Perry, Title I Teacher were introduced, explained their roles, and efforts underway to close learning gaps. Discussion included that since COVID-19, learning gaps are wider; however, they are noticing positive results due to the interventions. Mathematics facts was cited as an area that is a struggle. The School Board thanked the Teachers for their many efforts.

OLD BUSINESS

A. COVID-19 Team Updates

Mrs. Avery reported that the COVID-19 Team continues to meet weekly to monitor data and needs. The School is maintaining the current level of mitigation which is at Orange. Ms. Foote asked that the Team examine ways to provide indoor mask breaks as the temperatures are getting colder which may result in less time outdoors. Mrs. Avery indicated the topic will be on the upcoming COVID-19 Team Agenda.

NEW BUSINESS

A. School Board Policy Review Process Proposal

Mrs. Moriarty explained that there was not a requirement to have three readings and two readings will provide for more efficiency. Additionally, Mrs. Moriarty shared that the Board can always review/revisit a policy, if needed.

B. Support Staff Benefits Overview

Mrs. Moriarty shared the Support Staff Benefits Overview. Mrs. Moriarty indicated a potential change of one holiday to a floating holiday (at the staff members choice). Ms. Coleman asked to see comparisons of support staff benefits from other school districts.
