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
#### LANGUAGE ARTS with Ms. Korzendorfer

Thirteen year old Pierre takes his father's place as a voyageur on a 2400-mile, 12-week trip from Montreal to Lake Superior in 1800. Filled with guilt over the accident, Pierre works hard paddling a canoe filled with trade goods. At first, Pierre counts every one of the difficult strokes, suffering raw hands, teasing, loneliness and backbreaking portages. Then things start to change. Author William Durbin is a Minneapolis-born teacher and writer who has lived in the lake country of northeastern Minnesota for many years. He taught English at a rural high school and composition at a local community college. William wrote a sequel called Wintering.






#### LANGUAGE ARTS with Ms. Hendrickson

Anne Frank once said, "In spite of everything, I still believe that people are really good at heart". On Monday, the curtain will rise on Act II of the play, and we will continue to focus on two Universal Themes: *Goodness in People and Hope*. Throughout Act I, we established a timeline for the play based on students writing Plot Event cards that correlate with our Holocaust Timeline. We also practiced our empathy skills and considered what being stuck inside for two years — while hiding for our lives — would be like, and completed a "What I'd Miss Most" activity. As evidenced by their work here, a picture truly speaks 1,000 words.

As we wrap up our journey with Anne Frank, students will continue to track evidence of Universal Theme and prepare for their 1-Pager Final. We will also view the Academy Award-Winning 1959 film version of the play and compare and contrast both works. I am really proud of how well these kids have handled a heavy historical event and have treated each part of it with respect as they discovered another connection between history and literature.
