#### Fifth Grade Parent/Guardians

As a way to update student records and ensure attendance in the proper school zones, Charles County Public Schools requires all students entering sixth and ninth grades to provide two proofs of domicile to their current school of enrollment from the approved list. Parents will have the option to upload proofs using Online Registration through their ParentVue account or by emailing Mrs. Diaz, jdiaz@ccboe.com. Students may also send their proofs into schools no later than **April 11, 2022**. Students' 6th grade schedules will not be finalized for the 2022-23 school year until current proofs of domicile are received.

#### **Arrival Procedures**

Here are just a few reminders of our arrival procedures. Your cooperation with all procedures helps ensure the safety and security of all of our students. We appreciate your cooperation and support throughout this process.

- -Doors will open for students at 8:15. You can drop off your student(s) anytime between 8:15 and 8:30. After 8:30, students will need to be brought into the building by a parent so that you can sign them in. This will count as a tardy.
- -You may drop your child off along the curb near the front entrance. Please be sure to pull all the way around to the corner of the curb for drop off. There are staff members on duty to show you where to stop. Please pay attention to where they are directing you to go.
  - -Please have your child ready to get out of the right hand side of your car.
- -Do NOT DROP your student off along Smallwood Drive. For their safety, please enter into the parking lot and drop them off along the curb where there are multiple adults to assist them.
- -Do NOT PARK along Smallwood Drive and walk your child up to the school. Smallwood Drive is a very busy road and it causes a dangerous situation to have vehicles parked along the main road, as well as making it difficult for drivers to see when pulling out of the parking lot.

#### **Dismissal Procedures**

Please remember safety is our goal when it comes to both arrival and dismissal. We have implemented a lot of changes this year to keep our children safe. If you are changing how you are picking up your students please contact the office and your child's teacher to notify us of any changes.

Please do not walk up at dismissal with a car rider tag and expect to pick your child up. If you are a car rider you need to stay in your car and wait for your child to be brought to your car safely. If someone new is pick up your child, please make sure they are on the emergency card or you have submitted their name in writing to the school.

#### **Toys and Personal Items**

Recently, there has been an increase in students bringing toys and personal items like trading cards into school. Unless they are used for a special event or are a part of the instructional program and preapproved by the classroom teacher, toys are not permitted on school grounds as they are a distraction to learning. This includes handheld games, personal music players, portable communication devices, trading cards, etc. These items tend to interfere with the instructional program. Your help in making sure these items are left at home is greatly appreciated.

#### **Updated CCPS SOP's**

With the removal of the mask mandate in schools and on buses, the CCPS SOP's have been updated and shared with the school community. While we are no longer tracking students with COVID exposures and positive cases, parent/guardians are still required to pre-screen students before sending them to school. A student sent to school who is exhibiting any of the symptoms listed on the pre-screening checklist will be sent home. Symptoms include:

- New, uncontrollable cough -Fever (over 100.4)

-New onset of severe headache with fever -Sore throat with visible redness

-Difficulty breathing -Vomiting

-Diarrhea -New loss or change in the ability to taste or smell.
