Schedules & Flexibility 🐥

College Preparatory (CP) courses develop standard subject-area skills that are the prerequisite for any future college and career work.

Honors (H) level courses are higher-level classes that proceed at a faster pace and cover more material than college preparatory courses. These courses require a high level of academic maturity, interest and intellectual ability.

Advanced Placement (AP) are classes developed by the college board to give high school students an introduction to college-level classes and also gain college credit before even graduating high school.



College Course Enrollment

Berkshire Community College (BCC)

 Juniors and seniors can take up to 15 free transferable college credits per year.

Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts (MCLA)

 Juniors and seniors can earn up to 6 free transferable college credits per year.

Benefits

- Earn college credit at no cost, that can be transferred to another college
- Prepare students for the college-level class and environment
- Allows exploration in an academic field of interest
- Strengthens college applications
