Three types of questions:
 Charts and Graphs- identifiable because No Italicized Headers. Do these first.
 Experiments and Studies- identifiable because Labels "experiments" Do these second.

Multiple Perspectives- identifiable because they have labeled perspectives. Leave until the end.

Almost all of the information is in the passage.
 There isn't enough time to read the passage. Instead, SKIM and pay attention to the axes of the graphs.

Remember, this is a Science Reasoning test. Think of it as a Reading test with charts and graphs. Do not get hung up on terms and concepts you are unfamiliar with.
