# Planning for 22-23 School Year

- Students need to enroll in a full 7 period high school day. Select classes you would take if you did not take any college/ concurrent classes.
- Once a student has completed the enrollment requirements at a college for concurrent classes, the counselor will adjust the high school schedule to reflect high school and college classes.
- Students must provide their counselor with a copy of their college classes.



# What is Concurrent Enrollment?

Concurrent enrollment allows outstanding junior and senior high school students to take credit-earning college courses.

If you are a junior or senior in high school, you may enroll in college courses if you meet the admission requirements and other conditions.

\*\*\*\*National ACT 19/Unweighted GPA 3.0

High school seniors who meet the eligibility requirements are entitled to receive tuition waivers for 18 credit hours. Waivers for juniors may be available depending on funding.

- Students/Parents are responsible for fees & textbooks.



# What does it cost?

- Tuition is waived for up to 18 credit hours (6 courses).
- Student/Parent are responsible for paying for class fees & textbooks.
  - For Example, Redlands Community College Concurrent Fees in a semester:
    - 3 credit hours (1 class) = \$94
    - 6 credit hours (2 classes) = \$163
    - 9 credit hours (3 classes) = \$232
  - Class fees are higher at 4 year universities- OU, OSU, UCO



# Course Placement

At minimum, concurrent students must demonstrate college readiness in a particular subject area to be eligible to enroll in a college level course in the corresponding subject area.

English 19

Math 19

Reading 19

Science 19



# Workload

A high school student admitted for concurrent enrollment can not exceed a combined number of high school and college courses per semester.

Cannot exceed 19 semester credit hours.

1 class= 3 credit hours

6 classes combined high school and college= 18 credit hours



# College classes & high school credit

College government, college math (non-remedial), English comp I & 2 may be used to replace a required high school course of government, math or senior English.

AP credit does not equal high school credit.

AP exam scores are used at the college level and cannot be used to replace a required high school course.

Ex. Comp 1 AP score does NOT replace a semester of senior English.



# College Math Courses updated- New Gen Ed Options

Quantitative Reasoning- Arts & Humanities or Human Services Majors

Not intended for students majoring in science, math, computer science or business

Functions & Modeling- Business, Economics, Health or Social Sciences majors

Elementary Statistics- Marketing & Business Majors

Algebra for STEM- STEM or Technology Majors

\*\* Course names may differ by universities

\*\*\* Level & number of math courses is determined by degree program





# MHS Concurrent Guidelines

For each concurrent class a student is enrolled in they are allowed 1 hour for their course + 1 hour for travel/study.

1 concurrent/college class = 5 high school classes

2 concurrent/ college classes = 3 to 4 high school classes

3 concurrent/classes= 3 high school classes



# MHS Concurrent Guidelines

## Steps to enroll

1. ACT of 19 or higher .
2. Complete application for admission of your college choice, go to their website.
3. Request (and pick up) official high school transcript. Request from high school website.
4. Obtain counselor signature for enrollment approval, this form is part of the application to the college.
5. Meet with enrollment advisor at college and enroll in desired course.
6. Return to MHS counselor signed MHS Concurrent Contract & Copy of college enrollment. Review with your counselor what high school classes you keep and confirm final schedule for school year.



# MHS Concurrent Guidelines

Student is responsible for providing counselor with a copy of concurrent courses enrolled in.

Counselor will review courses enrolled in at high school and college with student.

Any changes to colleges classes- Must provide counselor a copy of any updates.

Concurrent contract - Mandatory, all students are required to have a copy signed and turned into counselor. Parent signature is required.



# Taking college classes.....

1. You are responsible for knowing when and where they meet. Colleges follow a different academic calendar than MHS. You follow both!!
2. Attendance Matters!- College classes meet only on specific days, which means they cover more information each time they meet than a high school class.
3. Instructors have a set policy for attending their classes and they expect you to follow it.
4. Take an online class at your own risk! Online does not equal easy.
5. Failing a college class may result in not graduating from MHS.- Don't be that senior that doesn't participate at graduation or has to go to summer school because they failed a college class.



# Taking college classes.....


6. Be aware of all deadlines and tests for your class and study!

7. You can not be on MHS campus if you are not enrolled in a high school class.

Off hours=off campus

8. Students are not permitted to study in the media center, commons or teachers classroom. All students safety is a concern at MHS .

9. Your counselor is here to help! Please communicate with us if you have any questions or concerns.



# When does my student enroll for college classes??

Summer & Fall enrollment after spring break & spring enrollment generally opens up around Fall Break.

Redlands may come to MHS 1 time to help enroll students for fall & spring.

If you miss the day they are here you will need to enroll at their El Reno campus

Check with their class schedule ( on the Redlands website) for enrollment offerings at Mustang High School. Don't procrastinate or you may miss out on the class day & time you want.
