

BULLDOG BUCKS ... are separate from Dining Dollars and are not included in your meal plan. Bulldog Bucks are accepted at all on-campus eateries, Pizza Hut, and Wingate Outfitters. Buying Bulldog Bucks gives you the freedom to purchase goods and services from Wingate Eats, and other approved campus vendors. The funds are loaded into your student ID and reduce the need for any additional credit or debit cards. Unlike Dining Dollars, Bulldog Bucks do not expire and can be replenished. The funds roll over from semester to semester and remain on your student ID during the entire duration of your enrollment. DRUGS ... Using, possessing, distributing, selling, manufacturing or transferring illegal drugs is prohibited on Wingate's campus. This includes prescription drugs that are not prescribed to you. Possession of unlawful paraphernalia associated with any illegal or controlled substance is also prohibited.

EMERGENCIES ... Stuff happens. When that "stuff" involves blood loss, unconsciousness, smoke and flames or anything else that should involve a trained professional, call 911. If there's an emergency on campus that requires action on your part, we'll notify you by text, email and phone call IF we have your correct contact information. FERPA ... Does mom want to check-in on your grades? That's a no from us, unless you say it's OK. FERPA, or the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, relates to your rights concerning educational records and information. FERPA gives you the right to inspect and review your records, including grade transcripts and other academic records. If you wish to share them with anyone, including your family, you must complete the Student Waiver of FERPA Rights accessible on the Registrar's page found here https://www.wingate.edu/academics/the-registrar/ferpat.



FINANCIAL AID ... To apply for financial aid, you must complete the FAFSA at fafsa.gov each year. Wingate's school code is 002985, and the application is available Oct. 1. You can review your current financial aid status online through your Net Partner account at aid. wingate.edu. Be sure to pay attention to any missing requirements by selecting the "Financial Aid Requirements" option from the top left menu. FOCUS 2 ... Focus 2 guides students through a reliable, intuitive career and education decision making model to help them select a major, explore occupations, make informed career decisions and take action in their career development.

GRADES ... Professors use a variety of tools to keep track of individual grades. Students should track this information for each class. Grades are officially posted twice a semester in WinLINK -- Midterms and final grades.

GUESTS ... You can have a visitor stay in your room or apartment for a maximum of three nights in a two-week period. Your roommate must approve if you're having an overnight guest - remember it is a shared space! Guests must abide by all University regulations, and you are responsible for the conduct of your guests. Be sure to talk to your roommate about your guests.

GUNS ... Don't bring one of any kind. See Weapons.



HEALTH CENTER

If you are sick or injured or need an allergy shot, immunization or sports physical, go to the Health Center in the Holbrook Building, but schedule an appointment first through the WU Health portal, accessible via MyGate under the Current Students tab. Click on Health Center. Bring your insurance card and your ID with you to each visit. The Health Center is open weekdays from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Walk-ins may be worked in. MY WU HEALTH ... The My WuHealth portal is where students can submit required medical forms, upload immunization requirements and insurance information, schedule appointments, print copies of immunization records and medical records, access educational materials related to current and past diagnoses, and access secure messages from the Health Center. My WuHealth can be accessed by going to the Health Centers main webpage healthcenter.wingate.edu and clicking on the "My WuHealth" tab on the right.

NAVIGATE ... Wingate's degree-auditing program, NaviGATE is an online planning tool that helps students stay on track with their courses to help ensure they graduate on time. Not only does it show what they have completed and what's left to do, it includes a "What If?" function that allows them to see how changing their major or adding a minor would alter their pathway. Another NaviGATE feature, the plan manager, lets students map out the remainder of their Wingate journey by assigning each required course to a future semester. Using the platform can help prevent a missed prerequisite or an overlooked general education requirement. And the more students who use the planning function, the better the University will be equipped to offer needed classes at the right times.

NETPARTNER ... Net Partner gives you control of your financial aid at Wingate from viewing and accepting awards to downloading and submitting missing forms. You can access Net Partner at aid.wingate.edu and log in using your Wingate University Email Address and Password. You can review the list of menu options from the Menu icon in the top left corner. Please be mindful that your menu options will vary depending upon where you are in the financial aid process. Be sure to review and submit any missing forms/documents via the Financial Aid Requirements page. Once your aid package has been issued, you can accept or decline your loan eligibility (if applicable) on the Student Loan Acceptance page.

NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION HUB ... A hub for incoming students where

PARKING ... All vehicles must be registered each year with parking decals displayed in the left corner of the rear window. Parking registration costs \$65 per semester for students to bring their car on campus. Students have the ability to submit a vehicle registration form on the Student Checklist. If you are not bringing a car to campus, still complete that task on the checklist by checking that you will not be bringing a car to campus. If you do not clarify that you are not bringing a car to campus you will be billed upfront for the vehicle registration. To avoid fines, park only in spaces that are clearly marked in properly designated lots: R for Residential, C for Commuter, and FS for Faculty and Staff. If your decal is damaged or lost, visit Campus Safety to request another. Parking violations may be appealed to the University Honor Council. Visit the Office of Community Standards WUSync page to complete an appeal form.

PAWPRINT ... Located on the northwest corner of Wilson and Main streets, PawPrint serves as the University's mailroom, printing and shipping facility. It is open weekdays from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. You'll receive an email notification when a letter or package arrives for you, please wait one hour before picking up to allow time for processing. QUIET HOURS ... As a courtesy to those you live with, you should be mindful of the noise you are creating during all hours. Designated quiet hours are from 11 p.m. to 9 a.m. on weekdays and 2 a.m. to 10 a.m. on weekends. Residence halls should be quiet at all hours beginning the day before Final Exams.

REGISTERED STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS ... is a group of students who

gather together for a similar interest, providing students the opportunity to become involved and engaged at Wingate. There are many benefits to joining a student organization: making new friends, developing new skills and abilities, working as part of a team, learning to set and achieve goals, sharing your time and talents, as well as having fun. If the club you're interested in doesn't exist, the process to start a new one is easy! Visit the Student Org Suite in the Dickson-Palmer Building.

RESIDENT ASSISTANT ...Resident Assistants (RAs) are student staff members who live and work in all of our residential areas. RAs live on the floor or oversee a building and are present to be a resource, assist with concerns, and for the development of community.

RESIDENT DIRECTOR ... Resident Directors (RDs) are graduate level paraprofessional staff members who live and work in our upperclass residential areas. These areas include Helms, South Village, Watson Village, and Wilson East & West. The RDs supervise the RA staff in their area and are a resource, mentor, and ally for the students in their area.

ROOM CHANGES ... If you and your roommate are not a great match and you need help working out issues, talk with your resident assistant to set up a mediation. If it's still not working after the mediation, seek guidance from your residence director or area coordinator.

SAFETY ... The Office of Campus Safety is available 24/7 and can be reached at 704-233-8999. Call for an escort to your vehicle or room, if you have car trouble or in any emergency situation. Blue-light help phones are located throughout campus and provide a direct link to an emergency dispatcher. SERVICE ... The final element of the University's motto, service is something we hope you'll embrace as a lifestyle. STUDENT HANDBOOK ... This resource, available under the Helpful Resources section of the MyGate website, outlines policies and expectations for your behavior and explains the Community Standards process as well as potential sanctions for violations.



SUPPLEMENTAL INSTRUCTION ... During the first week of class, you might be introduced to a supplemental instructor in some of your classes. This is a student who works for the Academic Resource Center. They have been hired and trained to work with the professor and the class to offer peer-led review sessions. Sessions are organized to utilize active learning, they do not take the place of lectures. All SI's have previously completed the course and earned a high grade.



TEXTBOOKS ... Yes, you'll need them. In fact, students who try to get by without them often set themselves up to fail. Wingate's bookstore is online. Go to MyGate, click on Order Textbooks Online and log in to view course materials.

W'INTERNATIONAL ... A signature Wingate program, W'International is your ticket to study abroad for 10 days for a greatly reduced fee, subsidized by the University. You must be a junior, have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better and be passing your W'International seminar to qualify. WORK STUDY ... Several departments across campus offer work-study positions which gives you the opportunity to earn a wage while studying at Wingate. Once you arrive on campus, be on the lookout to learn more about various jobs and how to apply for them. If there is a particular area you would like to work in, inquire there directly.

WRITING CENTER ... An important part of the Academic Resource Center, the Christa Helms Austin Writing Center is on the second floor of the library. Writing tutors won't "fix" papers or write them for you, but they will help you identify and improve your writing problem areas. 
