A tag line I used in one of my recent sermons boldly proclaimed that if you aren't living a life of love then you had missed the entire message of the gospel—even if you considered yourself as much of a Christian as Christ himself. I made the statement over and over during the sermon in order to highlight how easy it is for us to get lost and separated from one another, when we allow perceived ideas of traditional Christian values to take priority over the teachings of Christ. He calls us to find common ground.

"I say to you that hear, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. To him who strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also; and from him who takes away your coat do not withhold even your shirt" (Luke 6:27-29). In our divergence of media streams, news affiliates and social media opinions it has become too easy to lose sight of Jesus' encouragement that we love each other in spite of our disagreements.


So with thoughts of our common ground and our Anglican sense of the middle way, our Lenten theme this year will be "One Lord of All." We will return to our schedule for Wednesday evening gatherings, each session with an opportunity for prayer and fellowship, a simple meal, and an opportunity to hear from some very engaging speakers. Each speaker will provide opportunities for us to listen to different perspectives on why we need to be united in Christ. Each speaker has been selected based on their desire to help us find common ground, and the unique perspective they can offer to our church. Some you will want to hear because you assume they will be like minded, while others may deter you because they challenge your political or social perspectives. I encourage you to come and listen, especially to those you consider as opposition. All of our speakers this year will be Christians, from our own Episcopal tradition, with interesting stories of faith, difficulties and challenges. I am hopeful that we can come together in love and support by listening to the differing voices that reside within the body of Christ. This is an opportunity to grow in faith and love as an individual, and strengthen the bonds of our parish community.

He is truly one Lord of us all, and I hope you will join us beginning on March 9.






2022 Altar Flower Calendars
