The Road Ahead — A letter from the Vestry

As early as 2018, your Vestry has been discussing the need for expansion of our church campus resulting from both the increase in church attendance and membership, as well as the increased enrollment in St. James School. In order to address and meet the needs of the church and school, in late 2020, Fr. De organized a Master Planning Committee, chaired by former Sr. Warden Bob Keyser, to assess our building needs and requirements. The Master Planning Committee's sole purpose was to determine the needs for additional space for the church staff, the school, and the general parish at large. The committee then provided a wish list of these needs to your Vestry at the June 2021 meeting. The plans are to provide much needed space for everyone: additional activity space and classrooms for the school, dedicated space for the church for fellowship, Christian formation, meeting space, expanded church office space as well as multi-purpose space for mixed use.

At that Vestry meeting, after review, consideration and further recommendations of the proposed master-plan final report, the Vestry voted to proceed with reaching out to several architectural firms with requests for proposals. We expect to be receiving those proposals from the architects hopefully by the end of May. The Vestry will form a selection committee in order to make a final decision on an architect and hope to have a final Master-Building Plan of the project, in the fall of 2022. Once completed, we expect to

have several parish-wide meetings for presentations and discussions of the proposed building project.

GROWTH is good, especially during the uncertain times over the past two years, but St. James is simply running out of space. The school, which is not a separate entity from the church and is doing extremely well financially, will reach its maximum capacity (spacewise) this coming fall with the addition of the 3rd grade. Scheduling events at St. James is becoming increasingly difficult for the Parish Administrator for both weekday regularly scheduled activities and committee meetings, as well as providing space for outreach and community events, Family Promise in particular. If you have been attending the Wednesday night Lenten suppers, you will know that Green Hall has been at nearly full capacity.

Along with growth, comes the inevitable need for additional space and expansion, as well as the financial resources to fund and accomplish such. At the Annual Parish Meeting on January 9, 2022, Fr. De discussed this upcoming need for expansion resulting from our growth, which has also been a regular topic of discussion with your Vestry going back to 2018. The Vestry expects to underwrite the proposed building project through a Capital Campaign and would expect to launch this campaign in the near future. This would be the first Capital Campaign Plan initiated since the late 1980s for St. James, which at that time

existing church we are in today!! At this time, the projected budget and funds required are not known, and will not be determined until such a time as we receive a final proposed building project budget and estimate from both the architect and building contractor, once selected.

Lastly, we are mindful that St. James' contemplated Capital Campaign Fund next year may overlap somewhat with the current Go Forward Diocesan Capital Fund Drive, and that many St. James parishioners have already been contacted for their own personal financial commitment to the Diocese. We would only ask that you please prayerfully and thoughtfully consider your own personal, individual financial commitment to St. James' Capital Campaign Fund when the time does come, in the very near future.



Community of Hope (COH) Training Coming to St. James

Do you want to grow in your relationship with Christ? Do you want to acquire the skills to handle different life situations in your everyday journey? Then the Community of Hope is for you, where you will be challenged in your relationship with Christ, and utilize life skills to help others.

The mission of Community of Hope International is to create Christian communities of lay volunteer pastoral caregivers united in prayer, shaped by Benedictine Spirituality, and equipped for and serving in pastoral care ministries.

The volunteer pastoral caregivers remain united in prayer and community as their ministries lead them to serve in the congregation and in the wider community. The program remains rooted in Benedictine Spirituality and is based on the classic clinical pastoral education model used in many hospitals to train pastoral caregivers.

The training is open to and enriched by the representation of many denominations. The Community of Hope training awakens God's call by helping individuals discover and better understand their own spiritual gifts for ministry. Each participant is encouraged to make this experience a journey into wholeness and to use this opportunity to explore a "rule of life" through practicing sacred silence, Christian meditation, compassionate listening, pastoral identity and Lectio Divina - all within the context of Benedictine Spirituality. This experience builds community and develops spiritually centered pastoral caregivers.
