

Dr. Wanda E. Ward '72 is Executive Associate Chancellor for Public Engagement, Office of the Chancellor, University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign, where she provides strategic leadership for the university and broader community to advance the university's land-grant, public engagement mission. She oversees Public Engagement and Community and Government Relations. She joined the university in 2018 as the Executive Associate Chancellor for Administration and University Relations, where she served as Chief of Staff to the Chancellor.

Prior to joining the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign, Ward served in several senior leadership positions throughout her 26 years at the National Science Foundation, including: Senior Advisor to the Director; Head of the Office of International and Integrative Activities; Deputy Assistant Director for Social, Behavioral and Economic Sciences; and Deputy Assistant Director for Education and Human Resources. In addition, she served as Assistant Director for Broadening Participation at the Office of Science and Technology Policy (OSTP), White House Executive Office of the President (2015-2017).

Ward served on the U.S. President's National Science and Technology Council subcommittees and interagency working groups in the areas of the social, behavioral and economic sciences, and science education and workforce development. At the international level, she served as a member of the International Social Science Council (ISSC) Committee for Developing and Transition Economies (CoDATE) and the ISSC Executive Committee.

At the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign, Ward currently chairs the COVID-19 Return to On-Campus Operations: Community and Public Engagement Committee, co-chairs the Call to Action to Address Racism and Social Injustice: Community Action and Public Engagement Committee, and co-chairs the university's COVID-19 community engagement initiative. She is a member of the Carle Foundation (Urbana) and the Champaign County Community Coalition Executive Committee.

Ward also currently serves as Co-Chair of the *ad hoc* committee on Increasing Diversity and Inclusion in the Leadership of Competed Space Missions by the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine, Division on Engineering and Physical Sciences and Division of Behavioral and Social Science and Education.

Ward earned the BA in psychology and the Afro-American Studies Certificate from Princeton University and the PhD in psychology from Stanford University. She was awarded a Ford Foundation Fellowship; the American Psychological Association (APA) Presidential Citation; the Federation of Behavioral, Psychological and Cognitive Sciences Richard T. Louttit Award; and the U.S. Presidential Rank Award for Distinguished Executive. Ward was selected as a Fellow in the 2018-2019 University of Illinois System President's Executive Leadership Program.
