ABOUT OUR LADY OF GRACE CATHOLIC SCHOOL

Reverend Louis Forrey's vision to build a strong Catholic community of ministry and a K-8 school began with the founding of Our Lady of Grace Parish in 1946. Three years later, Our Lady of Grace Catholic School, staffed by the Sisters of Mercy, opened to 115 students on a 20 acre campus.

The parish and school community have been blessed with continued growth through the years since. Today, there are more than 2,570 parish families and over 670 students enrolled in OLG. The significant growth of the facilities has resulted in a corresponding growth in the faith formation and education programs. This Fall, OLG will open its impressive \$28M addition, a state-of-the-art Activity Center, which includes a performing arts stage, new full-size gym, lobby reception area, innovative learning spaces and classrooms, new cafeteria, professional grade kitchen, and the highly-anticipated preschool program for 120 Little Saints and Young Scholars.

Over the years, OLG has been honored with awards from the National Catholic Educational Association, Today's Catholic Teacher magazine, Apple Computer, and multiple trophies for athletics and activities. Beyond a strong emphasis on Catholic faith formation, OLG has a long and solid tradition of high expectations for teaching and learning. The school is most honored to have been awarded three National Blue Ribbon School of Excellence Awards by the U.S. Department of Education (2001, 2009, 2019) making OLG the **only** K-8 private school in Minnesota to earn three Blue Ribbon Awards.

Elementary School

A student's journey from learning to reading to preparing for young adulthood, and the approach to teaching the curriculum evolves through the years to reflect a child's developmental needs. OLG follows Archdiocesan, state, and national standards to guide development of the curriculum.

Our Lady of Grace Catholic School provides students with an outstanding academic program. Students bring diverse needs into classrooms and OLG holds steadfast to high expectations and standards for all. Teachers, with the help of teaching assistants, use differentiated instruction to individualize learning. Curriculum is enhanced with a variety of special classes and programs such as Spanish, technology, music and theater, and an expansive playground for all ages.

K-5 students enjoy 1:1 access to mobile computer carts and iPads in the classroom. Each elementary classroom is also equipped with a SMART Board™, enabling teachers to bring lessons to life electronically every day.

Middle School

Students increase their academic competency and confidence, with increasing accountability, in preparation for the challenges of rigorous high schools. OLG's challenging middle school curriculum provides ample opportunity for growth in the areas of faith, academic, social, and emotional development. OLG develops strong students who are ready to enter high schools where they rise to leadership positions within academic, athletic, STEM, and other clubs throughout the various high schools. The curriculum follows the Archdiocesan, state, and national standards.

Each Middle School student has a dedicated MacBook Air laptop computer for use at home and school placing innovative educational opportunities at their fingertips. With laptops fully integrated into the curriculum, students not only learn advanced technology skills, but also responsibility in managing these valuable tools.

SMART Boards™ in every middle school classroom further integrate teaching, technology, and curriculum, creating one of the most technologically advanced schools in the state.

Finally, students learn coding and as they advance grade levels and are afforded opportunities to work with drones, Lego robots, and 3-D printers.

Learning Specialists

Our Lady of Grace offers on-site resource teachers to support students with accommodation plans and ISP's. Specialists:

- Serve as the liaison to Edina's special education resources for students on Individualized Service Plans (ISP's)
- Coordinate support for students who qualify for accommodation plans in



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- the classroom and on standardized tests
 - Monitor adherence to IEP and 504 Plans
 - Lead staff development in learning disabilities
 - Help teachers with specific classroom strategies
 - Collaborate and communicate with each student's team of parent/teacher/student to build success both socially and academically

Our Lady of Grace Catholic School exemplifies the importance of living the message of Jesus Christ by serving those in need. Middle School students contribute community service hours each trimester as a requirement of their religion classes. Weekly, a group of 6-8 Middle School students have the opportunity to help serve lunch at Sharing & Caring Hands.

The Middle School Service Club (MSSC) is designed to introduce students to explore how they can follow in Jesus' footsteps as servant leaders. Through MSSC, students are asked to volunteer in support of a minimum number of service events. The MSSC is highly attended, and the students enjoy working together to help those in need.

The Upper Room

The Upper Room is designed for middle school students to deepen their knowledge and love of Jesus Christ. Meeting once each week, it is meant to complement the religion curriculum, offering students a unique experience of faith. Through discussions, games, and other creative activities, they are challenged to apply the Church's teachings to their everyday lives. We are blessed to have several Pro Ecclesia Sancta Sisters who serve, teach, and support the OLG community.

THE ARTS, ATHLETICS, AND ACTIVITIES

Beyond participation in music and art classes as part of the core curriculum, OLG students have the opportunity for significant involvement in the arts, including choir, band, and theater.

OUR LADY OF GRACE ACADEMY

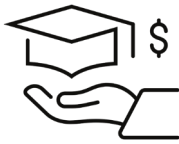

TRANSITION TO A NEW LEADERSHIP MODEL

As the parish community's \$28.5M Advancing our Mission capital campaign nears completion, and with the opening of OLG's impressive Activity Center including a new gymnasium, 300-person cafeteria, a professional grade kitchen, new innovative learning spaces, new performing arts stage, Middle School classroom space, and an Early Learning Center for its new Preschool, the need to be bold and visionary continues.

In collaboration with school and parish leaders, OLG's visionary Pastor Father Kevin Finnegan discerned the school's current leadership model in an effort to define the best organizational structure for OLG's exciting future. The result identified this new relationship-driven and collaborative model for school leadership, affording the school community a unique opportunity to expand the breadth and depth of expertise at the highest level of the organization in support of the 800+ students and young learners arriving in September 2022.

Under this new leadership structure, leadership functions are aligned around two distinct facets of school life: institutional capacity (Head of School) and instructional leadership (lower school principal PreK-5th and middle school principal 6th-8th), with the instructional leaders reporting to the Head of School. The Head of School and Principals have autonomous responsibilities based on the scope of their respective roles while sharing the responsibility for the Catholic identity of the school.

In order to assure dedication to the teachings of the Catholic Church and OLG's mission of making Jesus Christ known and loved, to promote unity within and among all the areas of the school, and to facilitate clear and consistent communications, this new leadership team will espouse a team model of administrative leadership in a highly collaborative and positive environment.

Supporting this collaborative team are shared parish leaders in advancement, business management, enrollment management, facility maintenance, human resources, marketing and communications.

OVERVIEW OF POSITION RESPONSIBILITIES

With this transition, the Head of School will bear responsibilities for all facets of school operations and external relationships while serving as the public face of the school community. The Principals and Preschool Director will be responsible for the educational aspects and internal relationships while serving as the chief academic officers of their divisions. The Head of School and senior leadership team will share responsibility for the Catholic identity of the school. The Head of School is appointed by, reports to, and is evaluated by the Pastor of the parish.

The Head of School is the chief administrator, role model that exemplifies our Catholic faith, and leader of the school community and, with the support of the School leadership team, bears the responsibility for the school's academic quality, operations and policies, consistent with its mission and vision. The Head of School is primarily responsible for ensuring sufficient resources, sound fiscal management, and long-term financial stability of the school through direct oversight of advancement, enrollment management, business affairs, budget, and facilities.

The Head of School works most closely with the Pastor, Principals, and School Advisory Council, and represents the school before the local community as its visible and engaging public face, providing leadership regarding the purposes, values, and goals of the school. In collaboration with the Pastor and the School Advisory Council, the Head of School will be responsible for strategic planning.

Meanwhile, the Lower and Middle School Principals and Preschool Director will serve as the instructional leaders for their respective domains and ensure a high-quality student and young learner experience through the effective functioning of the school's operations. Each are responsible for building instructional leadership through academic and student life program development and innovation, as well as the coaching, development, recruitment, and retention of outstanding faculty talent. Each are accountable to the Head of School for determining and resourcing the academic priorities of the school as well as ensuring the high quality of its educational programs within the framework of making Jesus Christ known and loved.

ABOUT THE AREA

Situated immediately southwest of Minneapolis in Hennepin County, Edina has a population of 53,494. It is a first-ring suburb known for its shopping and dining, its parks and recreational facilities and the excellent quality of life for residents.

Edina is just a few minutes' drive from downtown Minneapolis and easily reachable from multiple highways and freeways. The City is conveniently divided into four sections by Minnesota State Highways 62 and 100.

As a first-ring suburb of Minneapolis, Edina is just minutes from Minneapolis – Saint Paul International Airport, Mall of America, and downtown. Job growth is still fairly modest, but overall, the Twin Cities have a strong and prosperous feel.
