

## Class of 2022 Matriculation Report May 5, 2022

## **Class Overview**

The Class of 2022's 199 Seniors are enrolling at 84 colleges in 30 states and Washington, D.C. The class collectively received decisions from 195 colleges and universities. The 12 underlined schools are represented for the first time in the School's past five graduating classes (2018-2022). The average actionable applications per student was 8.6 (8.1 in 2021), and the average number of offers per senior was 3.6 (3.6 in 2021). Here and nationwide, an increase in submitted applications per student is attributable to at least three factors:

- 1. Most colleges' reduced emphasis on SAT/ACT
- 2. Most colleges are not offering traditional campus tours to help assess fit
- 3. Pursuit of scholarships
