

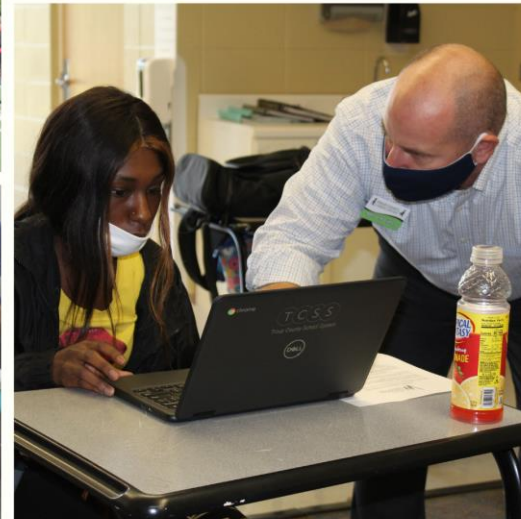

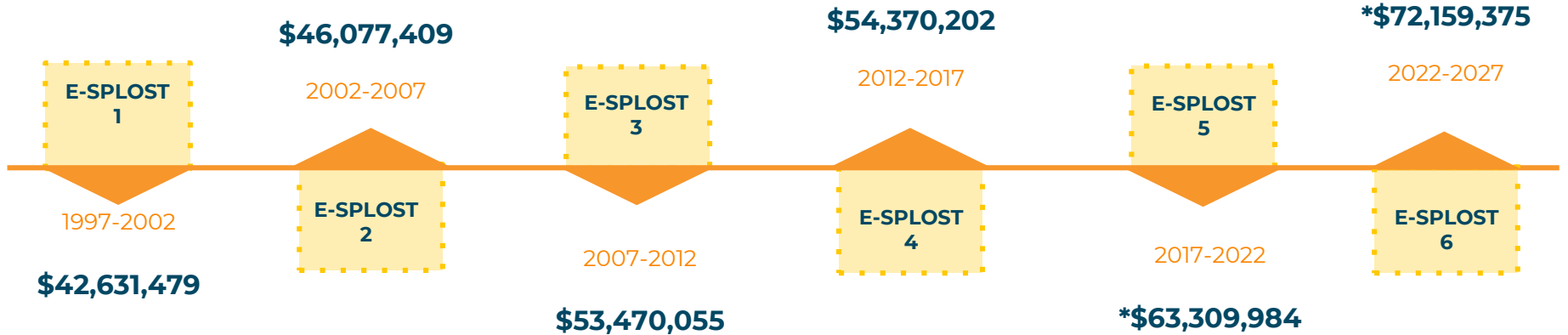
# Understanding Education SPLOST

- E-SPLOST: **E**ducation **S**pecial **P**urpose **L**ocal **O**ption **S**ales **T**ax
- Not a new tax
- A one percent continuation on standard county-wide sales tax
- Goes directly to education capital outlay projects

\*Alternative to E-SPLOST is school bonds which increase property tax and/or dramatically decrease school system budgets.

# How are funds allocated?



## Capital Expenses

- Renovations
- Construction
- Technology
- Safety Equipment
- Buses
- Land

\*Some supplemental funds provided by state



## Operational Expenses

- Salaries (including teachers)
- Instructional materials
- Fuel
- Utility Bills

\*Funding provided through local property taxes and state allocations.

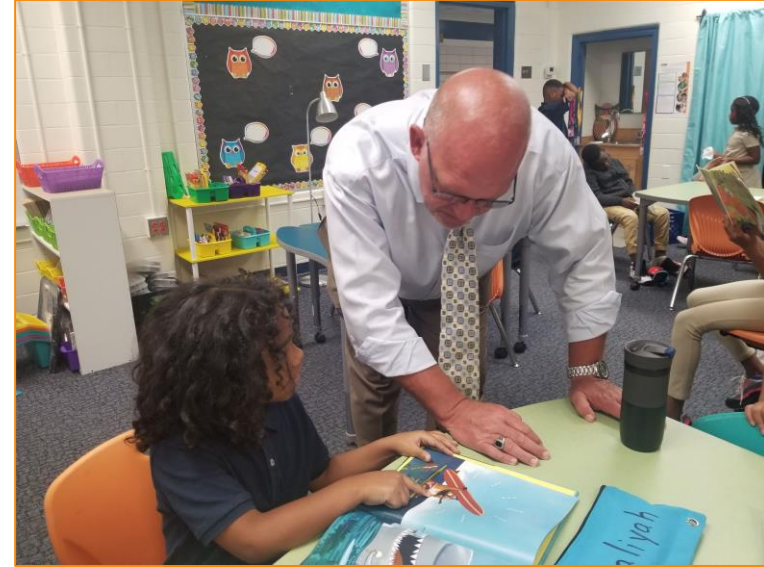

# E-SPLOST Investment Advantages

- Estimated **30% - 40%** of funds collected **from consumers** who reside **outside of Troup County**
- **Diversify tax burden** from property tax payers to all citizens
- **Predictable** revenue generation
- School bonds are more expensive and less flexible



# E-SPLOST Effect on Property Taxes

Education SPLOST	Dates July 1 – June 30	Amount Raised	Millage Increase to Raise Equivalent Funds
1	1997 to 2002	\$42.7 Million	4.495 Mills
2	2002 to 2007	\$46 Million	4.842 Mills
3	2007 to 2012	\$55.4 Million	5.832 Mills
4	2012 to 2017	\$59 Million (projected)	6.211 Mills
5	2017 to 2022	\$68 Million (projected)	7.158 Mills

**As a result of Education SPLOST's 1 – 5, TCSS has not had a millage rate for bonds since 1996.**

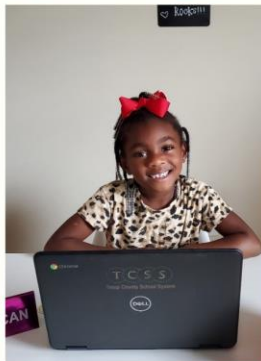
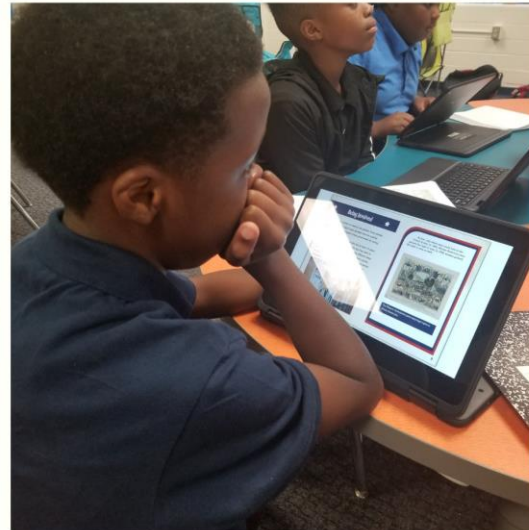
# New Facilities

- Callaway Elementary School

- LaGrange High School Athletic Facility
- Troup High School Athletic Facility
- Troup High School Fine Arts Auditorium



# Technology

- More than doubled internet bandwidth
- Purchased over 1,500 new laptops and desktops
- Purchased 9000 Chromebooks
- Purchased and installed interactive projectors and speakers for all campuses
- Complete wireless connectivity throughout the district
- Data Center supporting school system
- School intercom systems
- Surveillance systems at all schools
- Access control systems at high schools





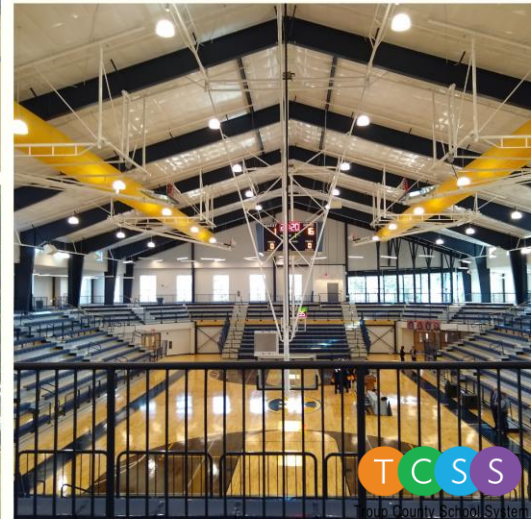
# Efficiency Enhancements

- New roofs at multiple schools
- HVAC upgrades at multiple schools
- Energy Management Program has generated district savings of \$5.3 million since 2010
- Repaving projects throughout system
- New gymnasium air conditioners at multiple schools
- School buses



# Athletic Upgrades

- Resurfacing tracks at Granger Park and Chris Joseph Park
- New gym floors at Franklin Forest Elementary and Hollis Hand Elementary
- System-wide physical education updates
- Lights and bleachers at outdoor fields
- Callaway Middle School football field upgrades





# Facility Upgrades

- Industry Certified Automotive Labs
- New flooring and paint refresh
- Main entrance improvements
- Classroom additions
- Media Center expansions

# Security Upgrades

- Security barriers (all schools)
- Exterior camera systems
- Security entrance systems
- Additional interior cameras

Maintenance	\$14.90
Renovations/Additions	\$8.25
Technology	\$7.61
Transportation	\$5.00
Safety & Security	\$2.30
Debt Service	\$1.50
<b>Estimated Total</b>	<b>\$81.81</b>
